Risk Profile

Conservative/ Low Risk: Generally low risk portfolios have minimal equity exposure or no equity exposure, resulting in far less volatility than a more aggressive mandated portfolio and in turn the probability of capital loss (permanent/ temporary) is less likely. However, expected potential long-term investment returns could be lower over the medium to long-term.

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments (e.g. bonds) may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality it vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.

Fund Objective

The objectives of the Fund are to maximize income while preserving capital; and to provide liquidity to investors by investing mainly in South African, high quality, short-term money market and fixed income instruments. The Fund will aim to outperform the STeFI Call Deposit Index, after fees. Capital losses are unlikely but will be borne by the Fund and its investors if they do occur. The Fund is permitted to invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments in line with the conditions as determined by legislation from time to time. The portfolio has adhered to its policy objective as stated in the supplemental deed.

Fund Investment Policy

The primary performance objective of the portfolio is to obtain a high level of income while preserving capital preservation and maintaining high liquidity. Any capital gains will be of an incidental nature.

Valuations and Transaction cut-off times

The valuation point for the purposes of calculating daily transaction prices of participatory interests including selling, repurchase, creation and cancellation will be before 18h00 each business day. Additionally, the forwarding pricing method of calculation will be applied to all prices.

Market Commentary

Economic and Market Review

The RMB/BER business confidence index in South Africa eased to 31 in the fourth quarter of 2023, from 33 in the previous threemonth period, moving further into pessimistic territory. The South African GDP shrank by 0.2% in Q3 2023, worse than market forecasts of a 0.1% fall, mainly attributed to persistent rotational load shedding. There was good news elsewhere though where the total vehicle sales seem to be back to pre-covid levels despite the automotive industry grappling with concerns over consumer affordability. More good news is the consistent trade surplus in recent times. In addition, we saw the domestic annual inflation rate easing to 5.5% in November, down from a five-month high of 5.9% in October in keeping within the South African Reserve Bank (SARB)'s 3%-6% target band. The bond market is actually pricing in a further reduc-tion in inflation as it sees CPI averaging less than 5% in the next 2 to 3 years.

On the global front, Statista analysis concluded that global Inflation actually peaked in the third quarter of 2022 and has been slowing down ever since. With inflation still at elevated levels, Developed Markets (US, UK and Eurozone) have maintained their monetary stance. The upcoming decisions on the matter will, of course, be data driven. The interest rate activity in the BRICS countries remains mixed with Brazil continuing to cut rates while the PBoC and the Reserve Bank of India continue to keep lending rates unchanged. On the other hand, Russia raised its key interest rate. Global growth is another mixed bag with some strong numbers from US (4.9%), China (1.3%) and Russia (5.5%) while UK (-0.1%) and Eurozone (-0.1%) printed negative numbers. We believe that going forward GDP numbers once again will become a critical decision-making tool in asset allocation.

Listed Property (16.4%) was the star performer of the fourth quarter 2023 but we also saw excellent performance from equities (8%) and nominal bonds (8.1%) during the quarter. Our valuation shows that both bonds and equities are attractively priced. However, the volatility in both equity and bond markets continues and we continue to preach the use of managed derivatives to take advantage of such. SA 12 months Cash at 9%, and with inflation expected to remain within the SARB's 3% to 6% range, is offering yield above its required return. To that end, we are again in an environment when SA equities, bonds and cash are all looking attractive and offering above their required real returns.
