## INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The portfolio will aim to maximize total return for investors by way of a flexible worldwide portfolio actively investing across equities and cash, both locally and internationally.

## FUND COMMENTARY

Stock market performance in November has, quite ironically, largely been driven by the cooling US economy, and therefore by perceptions of US interest rates that have peaked. The month was a good example of optically negative news having a positive effect on capital markets.

New US employment numbers at 150,000 were lower than previous months', the unemployment rate at 3.9% has now clearly turned "the corner" upwards and both the Conference Board's Services and Manufacturing indices dropped. These indications of a cooling economy put a clear dampener on interest rates, with a strongly building perception that the Federal Reserve' (Fed)'s tightening task for this cycle may well be complete and that their earlier threat of another target rate hike before the end of the year may well remain to be just that. This view is supported by US headline inflation dropping to 3.2%, with the cost of rent of accommodation remaining almost the only sticky part – and itself also dropping. The fact that US Treasuries have dropped from 5.0% in October to 4.3%<sup>1</sup> is a clear indication that interest rate fears are in process of abating and thus supporting capital markets.

It is important to stress the point that, in contrast to other cycles, the aggressive Fed tightening has this time not had a material impact on the US economy whilst they have built material reserves for late next year should they then need to stimulate the economy.

The reporting season has generally delivered marginally better results than consensus expectations. We have earlier made some portfolio adjustments due to the impact of the GLP-1 drug issues by lowering our Staples and increasing our Health Care exposures.

The best contributors to performance over the month were Microsoft, Cadence Design Systems and S&P Global, with Becton Dickinson the only negative contributor.

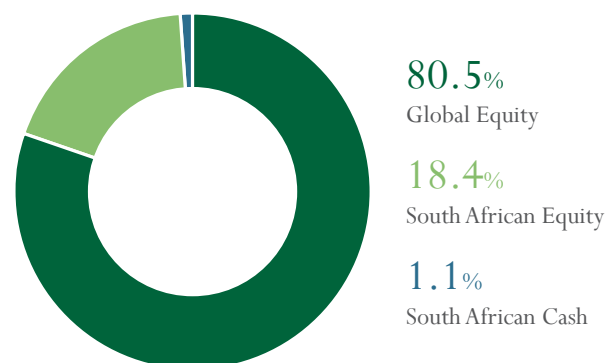
