
INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE






MARKET COMMENTARY

December and Q4 were a great epilogue to 2023 for equity and bond investors alike. The Q4 rally was driven by swiftly adjusting interest rate expectations (US 10Y yields fell by 47.4bps MoM) which were supported by the increased probability of a soft-landing – meaning lower interest rates, falling inflation and reasonable growth. Q4 accounted for roughly half the yearly performance of global equity markets (MSCI ACWI, +4.8% MoM, +11.1% QoQ, +22.8% YTD). US blue chips (S&P 500, +4.5% MoM, +11.7% QoQ), tech stocks (Nasdaq 100, +5.6% MoM, +14.6% QoQ) and especially small caps (SPDR Russell 2000 UCITS ETF, +13.7% MoM +15.1% QoQ) led global indices. Small cap outperformance was a welcome sight, showcasing broader participation in equity performance, compared to the previously narrow market led by the “Magnificent 7”. European equities (Stoxx 600, +3.8% MoM, +6.8% QoQ) were somewhat softer but US Dollar weakened (EURUSD, +4.3% QoQ). Slower GDP growth (Q3 2023, +4.9% YoY) and often hostile regulatory policy on both sides of the Pacific, made China (CSI 300, -1.8% MoM, -6.8% QoQ) the only major market to finish 2023 lower. It remains to be seen how long markets can remain uninterested in attractive valuations and reasonable cash flows. Consequently, some Chinese Internet companies were the only to register negative performance in December, with the exclusion of them constituents such as JD.com (+5.3% MoM) and Alibaba (+4.9% MoM). Risk-on sentiment and the high beta nature of themes such as cybersecurity and semiconductors meant they were the best performers for the month. Micron Technology (+12.3% MoM) and AMD (+21.7% MoM) being honourable mentions among our holdings. Clean Energy also enjoyed a great month alongside eCommerce and Logistics on the back of stocks such as Enphase Energy (+30.8% MoM) and International Distribution Services (+12.1% MoM). Align Technology (+28.2% MoM), a position we increased in November, was the best performing stock on an individual holding basis. In December, we increased our Coca Cola HBC (+5.0% MoM) weight after observing lackluster price action in H2 despite strong trading developments. Finally, we opened a position in AMD as we believe it can be a direct competitor to NVIDIA in AI enabling chips, but also to participate in the semiconductor industry recovery.

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GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Active Share	Active share measures the percentage of a fund's holdings that are different from a comparative fund's holdings. In this case the OMBA ICAV fund's holdings are compared with the iShares MSCI ACWI UCITS ETF.
Annualised Volatility	Annualised volatility is a statistical measure of the magnitude of the historical daily (logarithmic) returns of the portfolio NAV, scaled to be representative of a full calendar year using a 258 day count. Only the NAV of trading days are used in calculating this measure.
Annualised Return	Annualised return is a measure which rescales returns, for periods greater than one year, to a 12-month geometric average return.
SFDR	The SFDR Metric is based on how the underlying holdings of the Fund are classified in terms of the EU's Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation. Some holdings may not be classified or may be classified as Article 6 (funds which do not integrate any kind of sustainability into the investment process) – these have been grouped as Other; Article 8 (a Fund which "promotes, among other characteristics, environmental or social characteristics, or a combination of those characteristics, provided that the companies in which the investments are made follow good governance practices") or Article 9 (a Fund which "has sustainable investment as its objective").
Best/Worst 12-Months	Respectively, the maximum and minimum % change in NAV Per Share over a 12-month period using daily performance data.
NAV Per Share	Net Asset Value (NAV) Per Share represents the total market value of the portfolio less liabilities and divided by the number of outstanding shares.

Upon sourcing the underlying holdings within each of the ETFs: 69.1% are from 29 Dec 2023 and 30.9% are from 2 Jan 2024. Upon sourcing Equity Breakdown data from Refinitiv, unclassified data (which was not used) for each of the presented measures are: 2.7% for Company Market Cap data, 6.4% for Price-Earnings Ratio data and 40.9% for Dividend Yield data. Price-Earnings Ratio data from Refinitiv greater than 80 were capped at 80 (this amounts to 2.3% of Equity data). Within the Equity Breakdown section, Sector Breakdown is the sector to which each of the underlying companies are exposed (unclassified data: 2.8%), Country Breakdown is the country of headquarters for each underlying company (unclassified data: 2.8%) and Currency Breakdown is the currency in which each underlying company trades and it does not necessarily reflect the currency of exposure (unclassified data: 2.8%).

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
