INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

To achieve capital growth over the longer term by investing in a blend of collective investment schemes which either have a sustainable investment objective or promote environmental and/or social characteristics.

INVESTMENT POLICY

In seeking to achieve its investment objective, the Fund will invest predominantly in a range of underlying collective investment schemes (the "Underlying Funds" which comply with the Central Bank's requirements as regards investment by a UCITS in other collective investment schemes and where such Underlying Funds provide exposure to a portfolio of assets comprising mostly global equities and equity related securities (which may be listed or traded on Recognised Exchanges or unlisted) and cash.

Such Underlying Funds may also provide exposure to other elements, being bonds (including corporate debt securities and bonds issued by sovereign, supranational entities and/or corporate issuers rated investment grade at time of purchase from either Moody's or another generally recognised international rating agency), noninvestment grade debt, emerging markets, and infrastructure exposure (e.g. solar and wind power generation), subject to and in accordance with the investment restrictions set out in the Prospectus.

COMMENTARY

Equities had a strong quarter on the back of a US pivot on tariffs and improved risk sentiment, resulting in the Stonehage Fleming Global Select Equity Fund rising 4.0% in sterling terms and over 10% in US dollar terms. Continued appreciation of sterling against the US dollar has led to this differential in returns although we note this has somewhat reversed in July.

Unlike the first quarter which saw much better performance from companies domiciled outside of the US, it was a much more even quarter with US equities delivering similar returns to non-US businesses. This was fairly neutral for the equity strategy which has lower exposure to the US than broader markets. What was beneficial over the period was not holding oil and gas companies which performed poorly on the back of lower oil prices. There were also some good individual stock performances from holdings of Baillie Gifford Positive Change and Rockefeller Climate Solutions.

One area that did struggle in Q2 was healthcare businesses. Having had a good Q1, they fell out of favour on some sector specific concerns and because their lower economic sensitivity tends to mean they trail in a fast-rising market. The collection of healthcare holdings in the strategy performed better than the broader healthcare market but there is a higher allocation to the industry given their positive sustainable credentials

INVESTOR PROFILE

The Fund is appropriate for all investor types, including those with only a basic knowledge of funds. It is compatible with investors who do not need a capital guarantee (investors must be prepared to accept fluctuations in the value of capital, including the ability to bear 100% capital loss) and are looking for capital growth.

Due to the volatility of markets, investors should be willing to accept price fluctuations in exchange for the opportunity of potentially higher returns. This is a long-term investment and investors should have an investment time horizon of at least 5 years. The recommended holding period does not provide any guarantee that the objective will be achieved.
