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FUND COMMENTARY

Looking at SA asset classes, the Capped Swix was down 2.3% in February, SA Property was down 0.3%, with the All Bond Index also down, 0.6%. Offshore asset classes, the MSCI All Country World Index was up 4.3%, Offshore Property was down 0.6% with Offshore Bonds also down, 1.5% (All these returns are in US Dollars).

The Rand weakened in February against the US Dollar by approximately 2.5%. Looking at 1 year returns to the end of February 2024, Offshore asset classes have mostly dominated SA asset classes. The Rand weakened by approximately 4.4% vs the US Dollar over the last year to end of February 2024.

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GLOSSARY

Annualised Performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any I year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Total Expense Ratio (TER%): The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the Financial Product.

Transaction Costs (TC%): The Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the net asset value of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the Financial Product.

Total Investment Charges TIC (%) = TER (%) + TC (%): The Total Investment Charges (TIC), the TER + the TC, is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the investment of the Financial Product.
