

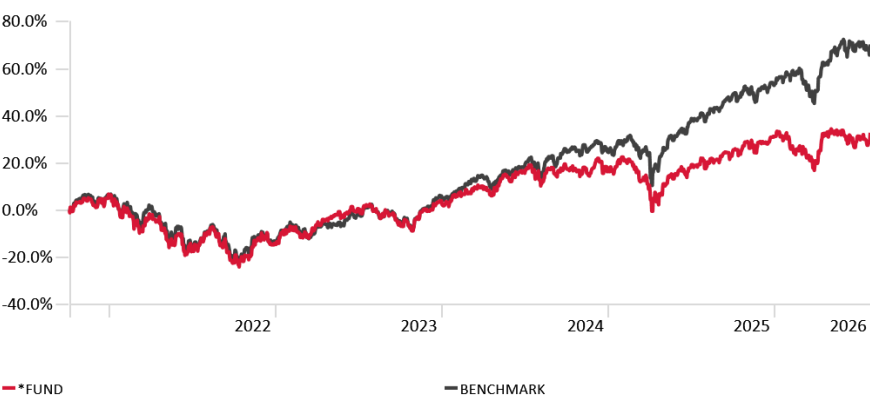

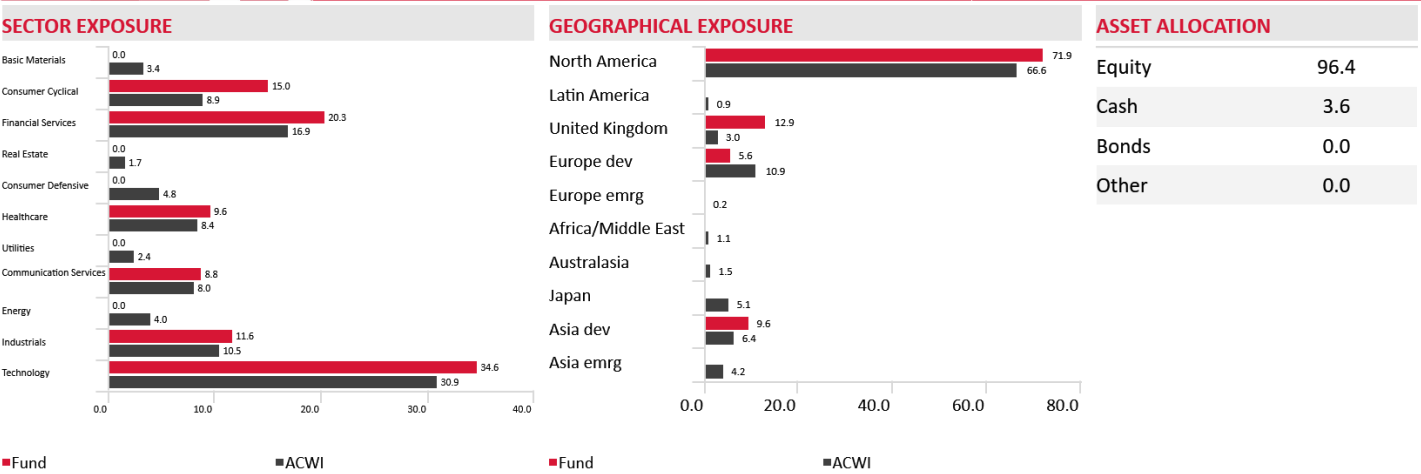

PORTFOLIO CHANGES & COMMENTARY

The Nomura Global High Conviction Fund delivered a positive return of +8.30% in the second quarter of 2026 but underperformed the broader global equity market by 6.63% (gross of fees). The quarter shifted sharply in character across the three months. April saw one of the sharpest V-shaped recoveries on record as the US-Iran ceasefire took hold and a strong Q1 earnings season drove global indices to fresh all-time highs; the Fund outperformed in that environment. May and June then turned against us. May was led almost entirely by semiconductors, and specifically by the memory and CPU names the Fund does not own. June brought a sharp de-rating of the mega-cap Hyperscalers as investors grew anxious about the scale of AI-infrastructure spending and its impact on free cash flow, a rotation the Fund felt acutely given its overweights in Microsoft, Alphabet and Amazon.

This narrowness was the defining feature of the quarter. Information Technology led global markets higher (+39.3% in USD) while every other sector lagged, and even within IT the gains were concentrated in semiconductors (+58.7%). Energy (-12.8%), Materials (+0.0%) and Utilities (+0.2%) were the weakest areas, and the Fund benefited slightly from having no exposure to them. The Fund's relative underperformance was driven entirely by security selection, while sector allocation was broadly neutral. The largest drags came from within Information Technology, chiefly the lack of exposure to the "big three" memory names (Micron, SK Hynix and Samsung Electronics, around -161bps) as agentic-AI adoption drove severe DRAM tightness, alongside Microsoft (-74bps) in the June Hyperscaler sell-off. Health Care also weighed heavily, through Boston Scientific (-183bps) and Zoetis (-135bps). We used these dislocations to act on conviction: initiating Safran in April, exiting Zoetis and Adobe where our quality thesis had eroded, and adding Tractor Supply and a small, deliberately sized position in SK Hynix, our first dedicated memory holding.

At the stock level, Boston Scientific (-32.0%), Zoetis (-39.0%) and Mastercard (+2.9%) were the largest detractors. Boston Scientific reset its full-year 2026 guidance lower at its April results and fell again in late May when management reset Watchman expectations lower and acknowledged PFA share loss. Zoetis suffered its largest-ever single-day decline in early May after a Q1 miss and guidance cut, and we subsequently exited the position. Mastercard, despite a Q1 beat, fell on results day as management flagged a sharp slowdown in cross-border travel spending, to 2% in April from 8% in Q1, reflecting its higher exposure than Visa to weak Middle Eastern travel.

Offsetting this weakness, TSMC (+37.7%) was the standout contributor, supported by broad-based demand for AI accelerators and CPUs; the company remains effectively sold out with over 90% share at leading-edge nodes and raised its full-year 2026 revenue growth outlook to above 30%, with the CEO later warning that supply would fall short of AI demand for years. ASML (+52.9%) performed strongly as WFE spending expectations rose for this year and next; it has high exposure to DRAM, where capex demand is rising most, and we raised our EUV shipment estimates. It also beat in Q1 and raised its full-year net sales outlook to €36-40 billion. Safran (+23.6%), a new April holding, contributed positively after a Q1 beat driven by a 63% surge in LEAP engine deliveries, reinforcing our thesis on the engine-aftermarket supercycle.

GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1-year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

An equity or share represents an institution/individual's ownership in a listed company and is the vehicle through which they are able to "share" in the profits made by that company. As the company grows, and the expectation of improved profits increases, the market price of the share will increase and this translates into a capital gain for the shareholder. Similarly, negative sentiment about the company will result in the share price falling. Shares/equities are usually considered to have the potential for the highest return of all the investment classes, but with a higher level of risk i.e. share investments have the most volatile returns over the short term. An investment in this type of asset should be viewed with a 7 to 10 year horizon.

Volatility is a statistical measure of the dispersion of returns for a given security or market index.

Tracking error is a measure of the risk in an investment portfolio that is due to active management decisions made by the portfolio manager; it indicates how closely a portfolio follows the index to which it is benchmarked.

Information ratio, is a measure of the risk-adjusted return of a portfolio. In this case, it measures the active return of the manager's portfolio divided by the amount of risk that the manager takes relative to the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio is a measure for calculating risk-adjusted return. It is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of total risk. The greater a portfolio's Sharpe ratio, the better its risk-adjusted performance has been (i.e. a higher return with a contained risk profile, where the portfolio manager is not taking excessive risk to achieve those returns).

Beta is a measure of the volatility, or systematic risk, of a security or a portfolio in comparison to the market as a whole.

Alpha is a measure of the active return on an investment. It represents the excess returns of a fund relative to the return of a suitable benchmark.

Market Risk Equity markets are volatile and the price of equities fluctuate based on a number of factors such as changes in the economic climate, general movements in interest rates and the political and social environment which will also affect the value of the securities held in the unit trust, thereby affecting the overall value of the CIS.
