INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The investment objective of the Fund is to achieve capital appreciation over the medium to long term. The Fund aims to achieve this objective through investing (primarily through collective investment schemes structured as exchange traded funds) in a **GLOBAL and DIVERSIFIED portfolio of equity and fixed income securities** allocated across regions, countries, and sectors.

The Fund aims to be invested in a moderate risk portfolio of equity and fixed income securities where the risk profile could be considered comparable to a 50% global fixed income / 50% global equity allocation.

The benchmark is United States Consumer Price Index ("CPI") plus 3% p.a., a common measure of inflation plus an excess risk premium.

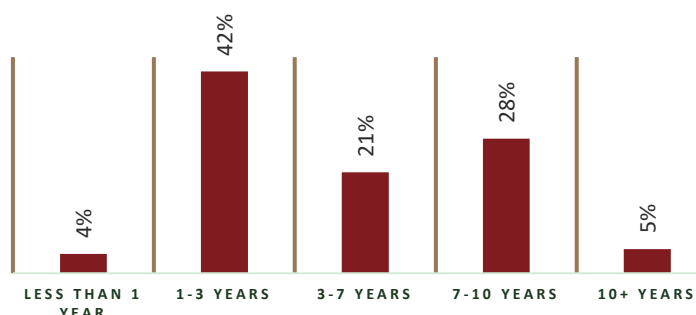

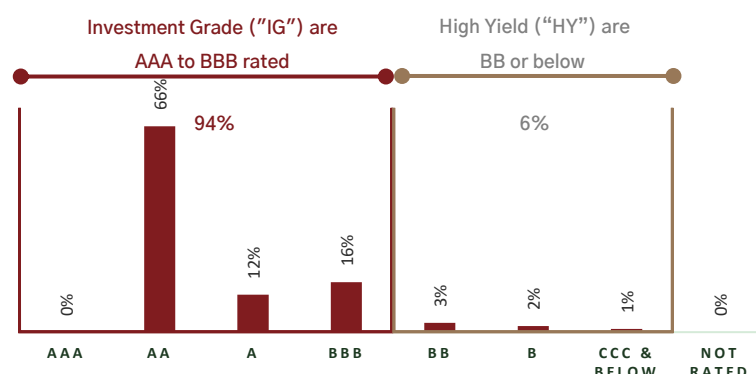

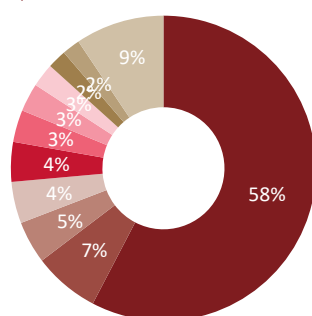

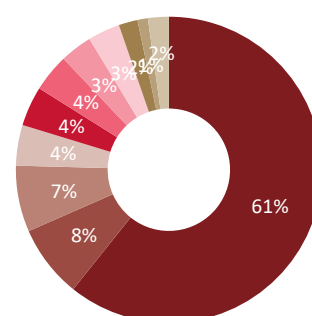

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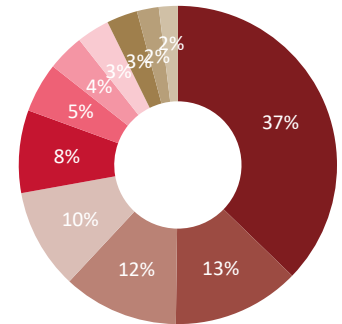
MARKET COMMENTARY

Global equities finished June lower (MSCI ACWI, -0.8% MoM) despite improving geopolitical risks resulting from the signed American-Iranian deal. Oil fell sharply for a second month (Brent crude, -20.8% MoM) giving back its war gains. Gold continued to slide (LBMA Gold, -12.1% MoM) with three forces at work: 1) the safe-haven bid unwound, 2) fears of currency debasement eased as the new Fed Chairman, Kevin Warsh, proved more hawkish, independent and orthodox than markets had expected, and 3) the significant deleveraging of speculative positions. European and UK yields were also rangebound (Eurozone 10Y, -2bps; UK 10Y, -6bps) and credit spreads remain near multi-decade lows. Inflation and relative Fed hawkishness pushed the US Dollar higher (DXY Index, +2.3% MoM). Notably the Yen seems to have found a new ceiling at 162/USD. Beneath that soft global equity headline performance, the real story was a rotation in leadership. Blue-chips gave up ground (S&P 500, -1.0% MoM) and technology stocks were flat (Nasdaq 100, -0.1% MoM), but breadth improved as small-caps (Russell 2000, +3.6% MoM) and the median large-cap outperformed (S&P 500 Equal Weight, +2.4% MoM). Semiconductors once again did the heavy lifting (VanEck Semiconductors UCITS ETF, +12.2% MoM, +92.7% QoQ), but the AI “theme” was notably volatile as investors questioned monetisation and the durability of the capex cycle by punishing hyperscalers. Leadership passed to the laggards of the AI trade as Europe (STOXX Europe 600, +2.7% MoM) and the UK (FTSE 100, +1.0% MoM) firmed. Japan extended its run (Nikkei 225, +5.7% MoM), now over 40% higher year-to-date. South Korea paused after May’s memory-chip turbulence (KOSPI, flat MoM) but remains the global standout this year; more troubling is how the rally is financed — margin balances continuously reach new highs as retail investors chase a generational opportunity and amplify momentum. Chinese equities were once again mixed. A drawdown in Hong Kong (Hang Seng, -8.5% MoM) and especially the communication services sector offset the stronger mainland (CSI 300, +2.3% MoM) and, with dollar strength, dragged emerging markets lower (MSCI EMS, -1.4% MoM). India steadied (Nifty 50, +1.7% MoM). In June, we increased our exposure to India as the energy crunch eases, consequently improving macroeconomic conditions. We view India as a volatility dampener which tends to move independently and now trades at decent valuations. Finally, we closed our position in German Bunds, switching back to 7–10Y Treasuries to close the successful long EUR exposure added in early 2025 and provide some ballast for the portfolio.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Annualised Volatility	Annualised volatility is a statistical measure of the magnitude of the historical daily (logarithmic) returns of the portfolio NAV, scaled to be representative of a full calendar year using a 256-day count. Only the NAV of trading days are used in calculating this measure.
Annualised Return	Annualised return is a measure which rescales returns, for periods greater than one year, to a 12-month geometric average return.
Best/Worst 12-Months	Respectively, the maximum and minimum % change in NAV Per Share over a 12-month period using daily performance data.
NAV Per Share	Net Asset Value (NAV) Per Share represents the total market value of the portfolio less liabilities and divided by the number of outstanding shares.
Positive / Negative Month(s)	A month is positive (negative) if the NAV Per Share, of a specific share class, increases (decreases) in value from the last day of the previous month to the last day of the following month.
Risk Indicator	The risk indicator for the Fund is set at 3 as this reflects the market risk arising from the proposed investments. The risk indicator is determined using historical data or, where historical data is not available, using simulated historical data. Historical data, such as is used in calculating the synthetic indicator, may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The risk category shown is not a target or a guarantee and may change over time. A category 1 fund is not risk free, the risk of loss is small but the chance of making gains may also be limited.
