INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to return CPI + 3% per annum through a full interest rate cycle while providing stability by aiming never to lose capital over any rolling 3 month period.

INVESTMENT PROCESS

This Fund invests in local money market, bonds, inflation-linked bonds, preference shares and derivatives to meet the investment objectives. Fund performance can be generated from taking interest rate views or duration, yield enhancement via credit instruments, asset allocation between income producing asset classes and also via the use of derivatives.

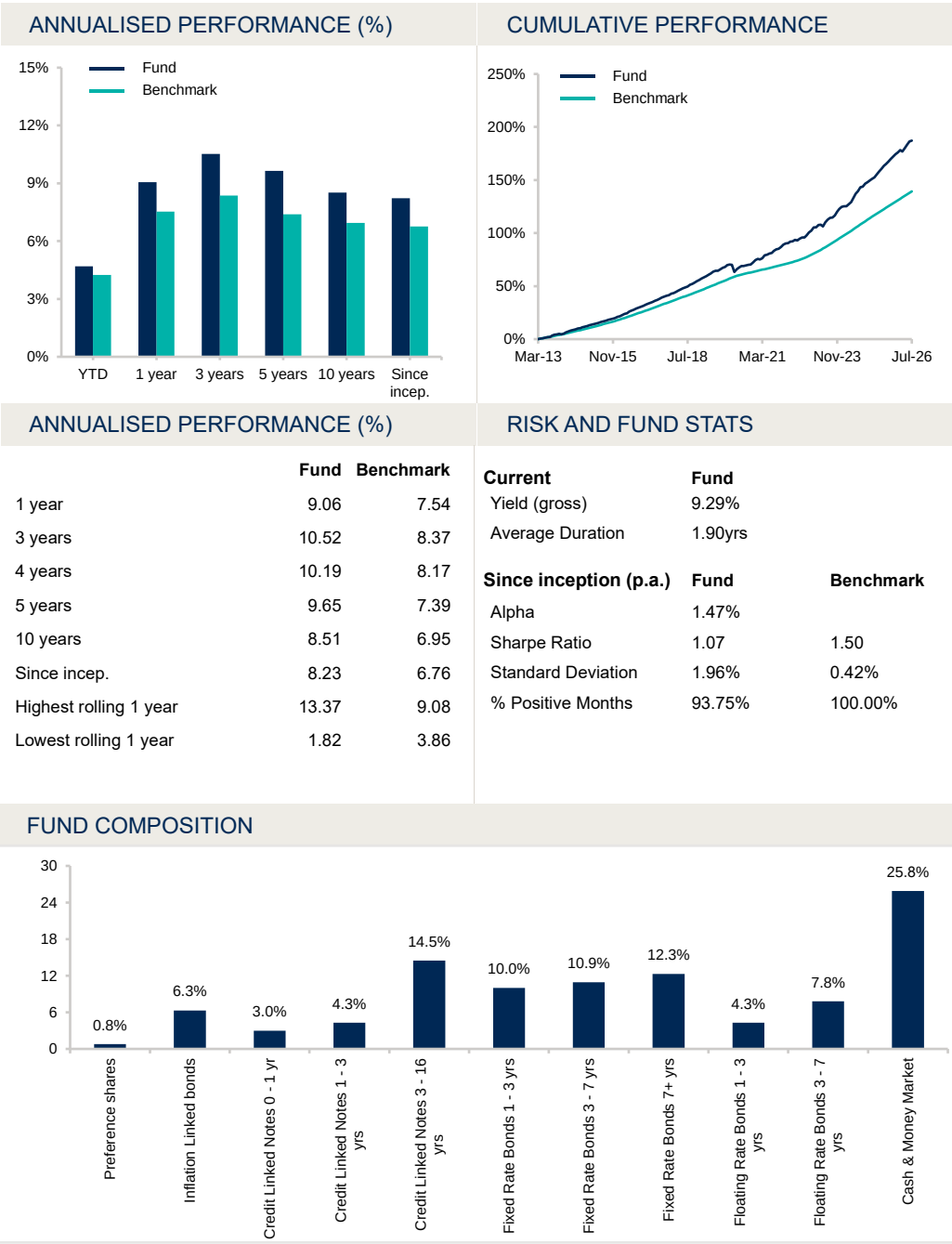
WHO SHOULD INVEST

Investors seeking stable real returns and aiming to maximise income via exposure to primarily the South African Money and Bond markets. This Fund is suitable to investors with a short- to medium-term investment horizon and is Regulation 28 compliant.

RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

These portfolios typically have no or low equity exposure, resulting in higher interest yields and stable capital values with the probability of capital losses over the shorter term (3 months) highly unlikely. These portfolios typically target returns in the region of 1% – 3% above inflation before tax over the long term.

FUND COMMENTARY

The tentative disinflation narrative of June went sharply into reverse in July as the Middle East truce unravelled. After US strikes resumed on 13 July — Washington hitting 80 targets and reimposing sanctions on Iranian oil, with Tehran claiming retaliatory strikes on 85 US sites including the Fifth Fleet headquarters in Bahrain — the supply-risk premium returned with force. Brent surged roughly 24% over the month, from around \$72 to near \$90 per barrel, undoing June's relief and reshaping the domestic inflation calculus. The turn was already visible in the data: June CPI, released on 23 July, jumped to 5.0% from 4.5%, the highest reading since June 2024, as fuel rose 34.3% year-on-year (diesel +50.8%, petrol +31.7%) and passenger transport climbed 8.1% on the month, even as food inflation eased further to 1.6%.

Against this, the SARB delivered a notable surprise. At its 23 July meeting the MPC held the repo rate at 7.00% on a 4–2 vote (two members favoured a 25bp hike), wrong-footing a market positioned for tightening. Governor Kganyago characterised the inflation outlook as having “improved slightly... but inflation is still too high while growth is weak,” reaffirming that policy is being set “to achieve 3% inflation over time” and to prevent the supply shock from de-anchoring expectations. The dovish-but-credible hold was well received: the rand proved resilient, closing around R16.54 (–0.9% on the month), while the 10-year yield backed up with the oil spike before stabilising near 8.5% into month-end. Offshore, the Fed held at 3.50–3.75% (a fractious 9–3 with three dissents for a hike) and the US 10-year rose toward 4.71%.

The Fund's elevated carry from money market and floating-rate exposure again provided a stable return foundation, and the defensive duration stance flagged last month proved well-suited as the truce unravelled. Positioning stays balanced: the renewed oil shock has re-intensified near-term inflation risk, but the SARB's signalled resolve toward 3% and the fragility of the geopolitical backdrop argue for patience over conviction. The Fund retains flexibility to extend duration should the shock prove transitory and disinflation resume, or to stay defensive should the re-escalation deepen.

The Fund's forward yield remains attractive at 9.29%. The Fund has an interest rate duration of 1.90 years. The current risk profile aligns with the Fund's risk objective, and we believe the Fund is well positioned to achieve its return objectives.

The Fund delivered a positive return in July that was behind its benchmark. The yield base added most for the month as did the fixed rates at the front end of the curve. The biggest detractor being the backend Fixed Rate Bonds in the portfolio.

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GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Average Duration: The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund.

Forward Yield: The Forward Yield is the expected combined income of the instruments in the portfolio over the next year expressed as a percentage of the current value of those instruments.
