

Interactive Equity Prescient Fund A

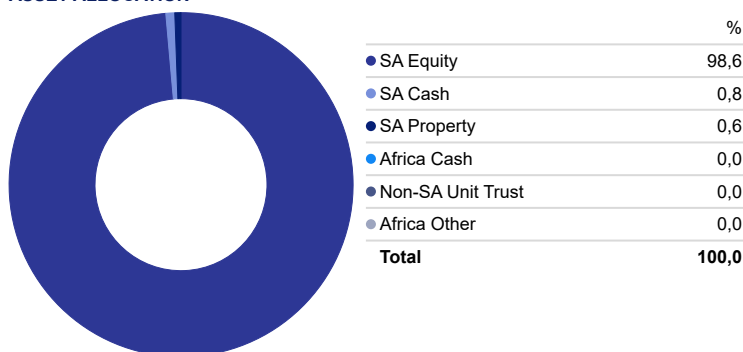
INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The fund is an actively managed South African general equity portfolio with a focus on maximizing total returns. The portfolio's objective is to offer medium to long-term capital growth. The portfolio will invest a minimum of 80% of its net asset value in South African equity securities, including listed shares on the Johannesburg Stock Exchange (JSE) and other approved South African exchanges. Up to 20% of the NAV may be allocated to money market instruments, cash, or other short-term investments during periods of elevated market volatility or when attractive investment opportunities are limited. The portfolio may invest across all sectors of the economy but will maintain diversification within sectors to mitigate concentration risk.

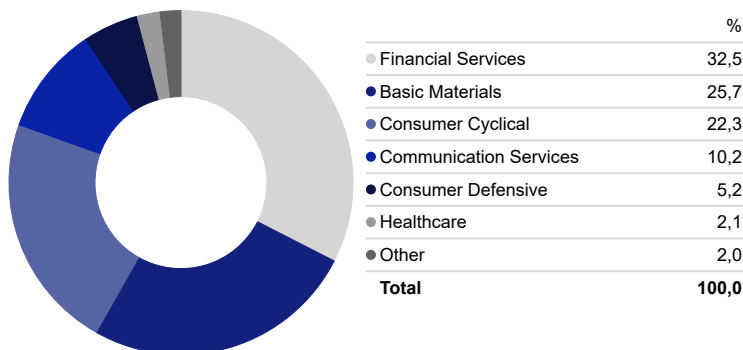
INVESTMENT POLICY

The portfolio has a long-term focus and invests in securities across all sectors of the JSE Securities Exchange which trade below their intrinsic value or have capital appreciation potential.

FUND COMMENTARY

The Interactive Equity Prescient A fund, launched on 16 April 2025, returned +5.20% for the partial quarter, closely tracking the Satrix Top 40 Index A2 which delivered +5.53%. The fund benefitted from strong gains in platinum group metals, with Northam (+53.96%), Sibanye Stillwater (+50.05%), and Impala Platinum (+43.35%) among the top contributors.

Of note, Valterra Platinum (+23.64%), which was unbundled from Sibanye Stillwater in early Q2, added further upside. The split allowed both companies to unlock shareholder value and saw investors rotate into focused platinum assets amid rising metal prices and stronger global demand.

Resource-linked counters such as Sasol (+22.77%) and Glencore (+15.45%) also performed well, supported by improving commodity sentiment. Global tech and financial exposures like Prosus (+14.40%), MTN (+14.77%), and Investec Ltd (+14.34%) further lifted performance.

On the downside, select consumer and retail names weighed on returns. Woolworths (-10.14%), Clicks (-6.22%), and Mr Price (-6.59%) faced headwinds from muted consumer spending and input cost pressures. Kumba Iron Ore (-11.89%) and Harmony Gold (-16.88%) also detracted due to production challenges and price weakness.

GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

FUND SPECIFIC RISK

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
