FUND COMMENTARY

We summarise reported results from Richemont, Prosus and Pepkor in this month's commentary:

Richemont reported half year results to September 2023, showing strong growth in jewellery sales (+18% in constant currency and 12% reported). Jewellery Maisons maintained operating margins at 35.5%. The strongest growth was reported from the Asia-Pacific region, supported by travel out of mainland China, although this presented as a stronger first quarter, with moderating growth in the second quarter (1Q24 +19% vs 2Q24 +5% in constant currency). Asia-Pacific accounts for 42% of group sales. Operating as a global business, Richemont is impacted by foreign exchange fluctuations, and the half-year period saw gross margin declines as a result of adverse currency movements (68.2% gross margin reported vs 69.9% constant currency). The group remains in a strong financial position with €5.7bn net cash.

Prosus interim results to September 2023 showed an improvement in profitability, with trading losses at a consolidated level (from continuing operations) narrowing from \$365m to \$124m. Prosus now expects its consolidated ecommerce portfolio to break even six months earlier than expected, in H2 24, having delivered a reduction in trading losses of \$232m in the period. During the period the group simplified its structure by removing the crossholding between Naspers and Prosus, continued its openended share buyback programme, as well as announcing management changes in the form of new CEO Ervin Tu.

Pepkor's full year results to September 2023 highlight the challenging trading environment South African retailers are in, with revenue growth up 7.7% to R87.4bn, and retail like-for-like revenue growing at just 0.7%. Pepkor delivered a 13% reduction in dividend per share to 48.1cps, with stock writedowns at Ackermans putting pressure on operating profit. Pepkor is reporting pleasing performance out of Brazil, as their Avenida acquisition boosted revenue growth in the clothing segment.
