

Investment Objective

The objective of this portfolio is to deliver long term capital growth through broadbased exposure to global equities. The portfolio aims to generate returns in line with global equity markets over any rolling 7-10-year period and maintains a high risk profile. The portfolio returns are denominated in Rands. Please be advised the portfolio may be subject to currency fluctuations due to its international exposure.

Investment Strategy

The **Oribi Global Equity Prescient Fund of Funds** will, seeks to maximise long-term capital growth by investing primarily in global equities. The Fund maintains a minimum of 80% effective equity exposure and invests exclusively in collective investment schemes. These underlying funds may include limited exposure to property, preference shares, money market instruments, and mixed-interest securities to enhance diversification.

While the Fund is focused on global equity markets, it allows for limited exposure between local and offshore assets to respond to changing economic and market conditions. All investments comply with relevant regulatory guidelines and may include both listed and unlisted instruments.





Equity Regional Exposure



Quarterly Fund Commentary

Equity investors generated strong returns in the third quarter of 2025, with strong performance across global equity markets contributing positively to performance. Despite persistent global uncertainties, markets remained relatively calm over the quarter, with little of that stress being reflected in equity markets. Still, prudent investing is about preparing for the road ahead, not just celebrating recent gains. Markets have been on a near one-way climb since April's lows. Periods of unusual calm are often followed by bumpier stretches. The question isn't whether volatility returns, but how investors are prepared when it does. However, the rand's appreciation over the quarter served as a headwind to global allocations, dampening strong offshore returns in rand terms.

The Portfolio is invested in global equities, which we expect to deliver significant inflation-beating returns over the long term.

Asset Allocation

Global equity markets delivered broadly positive returns in the third quarter of 2025, supported by easing trade tensions, ongoing enthusiasm around artificial intelligence (AI), and rising expectations for near-term Federal Reserve rate cuts. Growth stocks outpaced value, mainly driven by renewed strength in the technology sector. Emerging Markets (EM) outperformed Developed Markets (DM), led by China and South Korea. Japanese equities also posted strong gains, supported by a weaker yen, the announcement of a US-Japan trade deal that reduced tariffs on most Japanese exports from 25% to 15%, resilient domestic economic data, and ongoing corporate governance reforms. In the United States, the S&P 500 rose 8.1% for the quarter. While sentiment briefly wavered following the July non-farm payrolls release and a sell-off in U.S. Treasuries in September, equities ultimately found support from a solid second-quarter earnings season and a stable macro backdrop. Notably, small caps outperformed large caps, reversing several quarters of large-cap dominance.

Fund Selection

The contribution from fund selection was mostly positive over the quarter.

The Allan Gray Orbis Global Equity Feeder Fund delivered strong performance in the 3rd quarter, outperforming both its benchmark (MSCI ACWI: 4.1%) and the ASISA Global Equity General peer group (3.3%), and posting 1st quartile performance. Outperformance was generally driven by broad-based effective stock selection, specifically within the Industrials sector, with underweights to IT sector acting as a marginal detractor. From a country perspective, stock selection in the U.S. and Japan were relative contributors to performance. At a stock level, allocations to Nebius Group (+102.9%), Rolls-Royce Holdings (+21.3%), and Interactive Brokers Group (+24.3%) contributed positively to performance. Conversely, positions in QXO (-11.5%), Nintendo (-9.8%), and Bruker Corp (-21.0%) detracted from returns during the quarter.

The Nedgroup Inv Global Emerging Market Feeder Fund produced strong returns over Q3, delivering 1st quartile performance and outperforming its peers and its benchmark (the MSCI Emerging Market index). Emerging markets (EM) gained nearly 11%—one of their strongest quarters in years—and are now on pace for their best calendar year since 2017. Key contributors to performance include strong stock selection within Asian markets, particularly in Chinese and Taiwanese equities. Allocations to Tencent Holdings (+32.9%), Alibaba Group (+82.64%), and Taiwan Semiconductor (+18.46%) were the primary drivers of outperformance during the quarter. From a sector perspective, stock selection within Consumer Discretionary and Information Technology added significant value. However, holdings in Indian Financials and Telecommunications detracted from performance, with Max Healthcare Institute (-15.38%), 2Fin Holdings (-31.83%), and Indus Towers (-21.35%) weighing on relative returns. Despite these detractors, the funds overweight positioning in high-quality Asian growth companies proved beneficial during the quarter.

Ninety One Global Franchise Feeder Fund struggled during the 3rd quarter, as the combination of a strong rally in mega-cap technology stocks and financial stocks were headwinds to relative returns. Returns for the quarter were in the bottom quartile relative to the peer group. While positions in ASML (+19.1%) and Alphabet (+34.0%) were strong contributors to returns during the period, these gains were offset by positions in Philip Morris International (-13.5%), Intuit (-15.7%) and Booking Holdings (-9.3%) which detracted from performance.

There were no changes made to the underlying funds in the third quarter.

Summary

We are pleased that the Portfolio delivered a solid return over the third quarter, with equity markets posting positive returns over the quarter. We remain comfortable with the positioning of the Portfolio, both from a sector and regional allocation and a manager selection perspective. The Portfolio continues to be allocated to a diverse range of attractively priced global investments. We are confident that it will be able to deliver on its objective over the long term. The fund adhered to its policy objectives.
