INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to deliver returns close to the MSCI Emerging Markets Index Total Return at low cost. Although the Fund is structured similarly to the MSCI Emerging Markets Index, it is not a tracker fund and can out / underperform the MSCI Emerging Markets Index by small amounts over time.

INVESTMENT PROCESS

The Fund follows an investment process which firstly endeavours to follow the composition of the MSCI Emerging Markets Index closely and secondly seeks enhancement opportunities to secure for investors an optimum overall return. The Fund can use derivatives to create exposure to the MSCI Emerging Markets Index or subsets thereof in a low cost and efficient manner.

WHO SHOULD INVEST

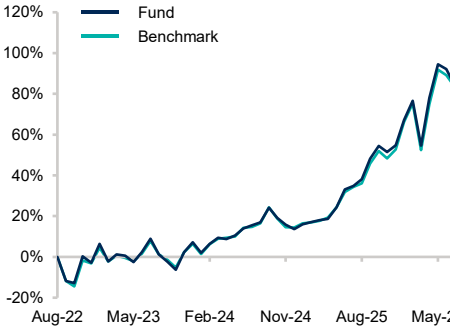

RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

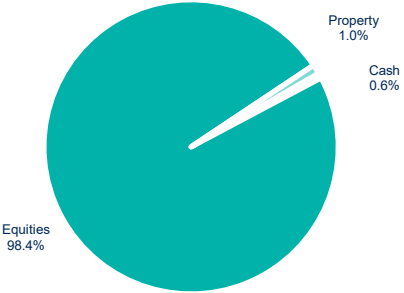

FUND COMMENTARY

Global equity markets spent July pulled between two competing stories. Early in the month, renewed tension between the United States and Iran pushed oil prices sharply higher, reviving inflation concerns and lifting global bond yields. As those geopolitical concerns eased, attention turned back to second-quarter earnings and, more pointedly, to whether the scale of capital spending on artificial intelligence can be justified by the returns it is expected to generate. The MSCI World Index gained 0.51% for the month. The more telling movement happened beneath the index level: rather than a broad retreat from AI and technology, the earnings season made investors far more selective about where future profits are likely to land, with capital rotating toward energy and financials and away from semiconductors and the wider technology complex.

In the United States, the S&P 500 was broadly flat, down a marginal 0.06%, despite a supportive reporting season in which most companies beat expectations. For the largest technology names, meeting forecasts was no longer enough and investors wanted evidence that heavy AI-related capital expenditure would translate into future earnings, and that scrutiny drove the rotation away from the sector. European equities gained 0.67%, helped by a greater weighting toward financials and industrials and a lower exposure to technology. Japan illustrated the same rotation in miniature: the Nikkei 225 fell 6.25%, weighed down by its heavier technology and semiconductor exposure and compounded by higher oil prices given the country's reliance on imported energy.

Emerging markets also weakened, with the MSCI Emerging Markets Index declining 3.07%. The weakness was concentrated in South Korea and Taiwan, where the reversal in semiconductor shares following their strong AI driven rally weighed heavily on the index. China was comparatively more resilient and was a positive contributor to the broader EM index, although the CSI 300 itself declined 7.38% during the month.

Locally, the FTSE/JSE All Share Index gained 1.18%, with gains broad-based across sectors. Technology was the strongest performer, up 6.08% as it partially reversed earlier losses, though it remains 20.98% lower year to date. Listed Property added 2.30% on improving operating conditions and attractive relative yields, Basic Materials rose 2.06% on firmer commodity prices, and Financials gained 1.16%. The rand weakened 0.86% against the US dollar as headline inflation rose to 5.0% on higher energy costs; the South African Reserve Bank kept the repo rate unchanged at 7.0%.

Overall, July was defined more by rotation than by any broad shift in risk appetite. Resilient earnings provided underlying support, but investors grew more selective within AI and technology as capital expenditure commitments came under greater scrutiny. Locally, the JSE held up well on resource and financial strength, with technology staging a partial recovery. Higher oil prices and renewed geopolitical tensions were a reminder that inflation risks remain a live consideration for markets.

The top contributors to the Fund's performance for the month were Alibaba (26.02%), Tencent (10.57%) and Meituan (35.04%). Detractors included SK Hynix (-29.55%), Samsung Electronics (-14.59%) and MediaTek (-17.45%).

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GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Dividend Yield: The weighted average dividend yield of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The dividend yield of each company is the dividends per share divided by the price.

PE Ratio: The weighted average price earnings ratio of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The price earnings ratio of each company is the price divided by the earnings per share.

Fund Specific Risks

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.

Derivatives risk: The use of derivatives could increase overall risk by magnifying the effect of both gains and losses in a Fund. As such, large changes in value and potentially large financial losses could result.

Interest rate risk: The value of fixed income investments (e.g. bonds) tends to be inversely related to interest and inflation rates. Hence their value decreases when interest rates and/or inflation rises.

Transaction cost are a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

Where a current yield has been included for Funds that derive its income primarily from interest bearing income, the yield is a weighted average yield of all underlying interest bearing instruments as at the last day of the month. This yield is subject to change as market rates and underlying investments change.
