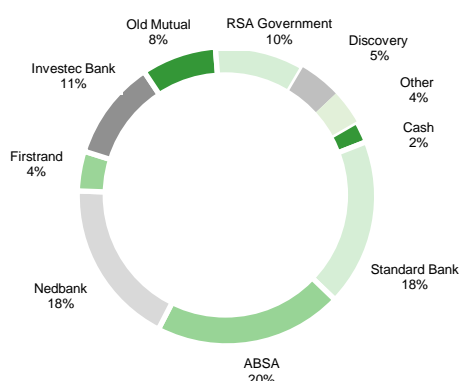

## FUND COMMENTARY

The South African government's 10-year bond yield (10.67%), which spiked sharply at the end of January, likely in response to escalating tensions with the US, has since settled into a new trading range but ticked higher again toward month-end (+9bp). The spread over 10-year US Treasuries widened slightly to 6.42% (+11bp), its highest level since May last year, just ahead of the local elections.

Although the South African Reserve Bank (SARB) never openly acknowledges it, it remains reluctant to cut rates unless the Federal Reserve does, wary of unsettling the currency markets. Persistent rand weakness continues to hang over the outlook, consistently skewing inflation risks to the upside. Governor Kganyago reaffirmed that the Bank will continue to calibrate policy based on incoming data. The current base case remains two more 25bp cuts this year.

### General Information

This yield is subject to change as market rates and underlying investments change.

### Total Expense Ratio (TER)

The Fund's **Total Expense Ratio (TER)** reflects the percentage of the average **Net Asset Value (NAV)** of the portfolio that was incurred as charges, levies and fees related to the management of the portfolio. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TER's. During the phase in period TER's do not include information gathered over a full year.

### Transaction Costs (TC)

Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's underlying assets. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

### Total Investment Charge (TIC)

The sum of the TER and TC. The accurate figures will be available a year after the fund's inception date.

### Glossary Summary

**Performance:** Performance has been calculated using NAV to NAV with income reinvested.

**Conservative:** These portfolios typically have no or low equity exposure, resulting in higher interest yields and stable capital values with the probability of capital losses over the shorter term (3 months) highly unlikely.

### Fund Specific Risk

**Default Risk:** The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.

**Derivatives Risk:** The use of derivatives could increase overall risk by magnifying the effect of both gains and losses in a Fund. As such, large changes in value and potentially large financial losses could result.

**Interest Rate Risk:** The value of fixed income investments (e.g. bonds) tends to be inversely related to interest and inflation rates. Hence their value decreases when interest rates and/or inflation rises.
