The Fund aims to provide investors with long-term capital growth through investment in global equity markets.

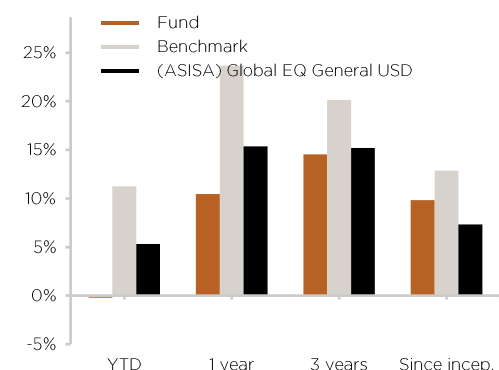
Investment Policy

RISK INDICATOR

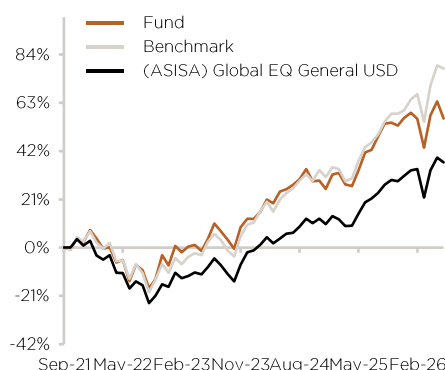


ANNUALISED PERFORMANCE (%)

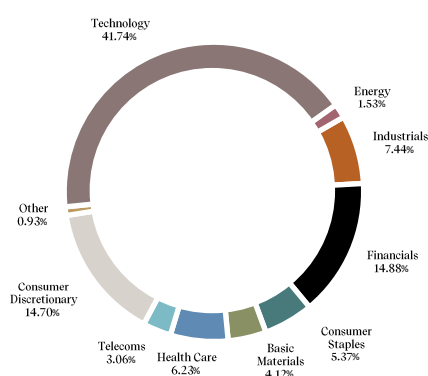

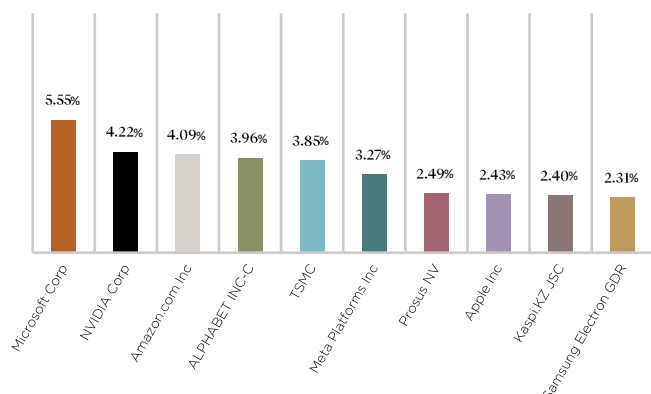

Income Distribution:

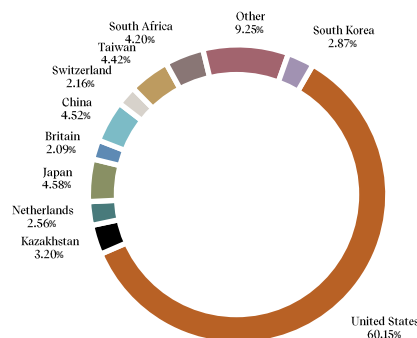

MARKET COMMENTARY

The fund returned -4.54% for the month, underperforming the benchmark by 3.73%. The Momentum factor has continued to post record outperformance versus the market and other factors. This has created a narrow market over the last 3.5 years where only ~30% of stocks outperform the S&P 500 and MSCI Emerging Market benchmarks. The Fairtree global funds are always positioned overweight Value, Growth and Quality on an absolute and relative basis, but our exposure to Momentum is traditionally only marginally positive. This has therefore not been a market environment conducive to our fund's style. The momentum run has been fuelled by growth in Leveraged ETFs crossing the \$200bn mark and same-day-expiry option trading going through the 50% mark. The sectors that benefited from this Momentum factor are Semiconductors (which grew from ~5% in the S&P 500 a couple of years ago to ~20%), Power and Infrastructure plays. These picks-and-shovel plays are beneficiaries of the AI capex boom, while Hyperscalers, Software and Platform companies are used as funders.

Global equity markets consolidated in June as the strong run in AI and semiconductor stocks paused, and a more hawkish shift in interest rate expectations weighed on the sectors that led the market higher. US equities were softer, with the S&P 500 down 0.95% and the Nasdaq declining 0.12%, as elevated valuations and a more cautious rates outlook tempered risk appetite. The Federal Reserve left its target range unchanged at 3.50% to 3.75% at its June meeting and adopted a more hawkish tone, signalling that a further hike was possible, which supported the US dollar. Geopolitics remained a key driver, with oil prices falling sharply as the conflict between the United States and Iran de-escalated and supply returned to the market. Brent crude declined 20.8%, retracing back towards pre-war levels, although renewed strikes late in the month were a reminder that the situation remains fragile. The US labour market stayed resilient, with May payrolls rising 172k and unemployment holding at 4.3%, reinforcing the Fed's patient stance. Gold fell 11.3% as safe-haven demand unwound as the dollar strengthened.

European equity markets were among the few to advance in June, with the MSCI Europe Index rising 0.94%. The Netherlands was again the standout performer, rising 11.8% as ASML continued to benefit from strong investor appetite for AI infrastructure exposure, while Switzerland gained 5.0%. Germany was notably weaker, declining 3.2%. The European Central Bank raised its three key policy rates by 25 basis points at its June meeting, taking the deposit rate to 2.25%, its first hike since 2023, as the Middle East conflict added to inflationary pressures. Eurozone inflation rose to 3.2% in May from 3% in April, its highest level since September 2023, keeping the central bank focused on price stability.

On a sector level, Financials was the best performing sector over the month, where the fund's stock selection detracted from relative performance despite an overweight position. The fund's overweight holdings in the Information Technology and Materials sectors were the largest detractors of relative performance. Stock picking in the Consumer Staples and Energy sectors contributed positively to relative performance.

Notable portfolio actions during June included continued additions to high-conviction technology and AI-related exposure. The fund added to existing holdings in Amazon, Microsoft, Alphabet and Samsung. The fund also added to Kaspi, taking advantage of share price weakness. On the reduction side, the fund trimmed its holdings in Dell and Impala Platinum, and fully exited TDK Corp, Repsol, Japan Material and BHP, reducing positions where the risk-reward or portfolio fit had become less compelling.

Notable contributors to fund performance were positions in SCREEN Holdings (+27bps absolute and +26bps relative), KLA Corporation (+25bps absolute and +10bps relative) and SK Hynix (+16bps absolute and -1bps relative). Notable detractors from performance over the month came from Microsoft (-101bps absolute and -48bps relative), Amazon (-39bps absolute and -9bps relative) and Impala Platinum (-37bps absolute and -37bps relative). The fund is positioned with an underweight in cyclical names, in favour of technology exposure. From a geographical perspective, the fund remains underweight North America, while being overweight South Africa, Kazakhstan and China.



Glossary

Annualised Performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest Performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Sortino Ratio: A measure of the risk-adjusted return of a portfolio. It is a modification of the Sharpe ratio but only penalises the returns falling below a user specified target, or required rate of return, while the Sharpe ratio penalises both upside and downside volatility equally.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Performance Fee Cap: The maximum performance fee that can be charged over a specified period

Specific Risk
