### nvestment Objective

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The Fund provides a platform for the investment in diverse opportunities across Africa, excluding South Africa. It is a long-only fund that has a broad mandate to effectively capture the full range of investment opportunities related to Africa. The Fund will invest predominantly in publicly listed equities across Africa excluding South Africa. The Fund aims to outperform and capture the opportunity set better than the African equity markets.

### Commentary

The Limpopo Africa Fund rose 2.6% in October, trailing the benchmark's 3.7%. Egypt led returns, extending September's strength with broad-based gains.

Kenya also contributed positively, driven by financials and consumer packaged goods. Ghanaian communications added, aided by local currency appreciation versus the U.S. dollar.

Detractors included Ugandan utilities, while Morocco followed on from September's weakness with marginal, broad-based declines.

Commodities were a strong contributor, notably precious and industrial metals with modest support from oil & gas.

We remain constructive on Africa ex-SA equities, supported by attractive valuations, improving company fundamentals, and a firmer macro backdrop.

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





Highest & Lowest return: The highest and lowest returns for any 1 year over the period since inception have been

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities

High Water Mark: The highest level of performance achieved over a specified pe

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A Feeder Fund is a portfolio that invests in a single portfolio of a collective investment scheme which levies its own charges, and which could result in a higher fee structure for the feeder fund.

Conservative: Generally low risk portfolios have minimal equity exposure or no equity exposure, resulting in far less volatility than a more aggressive mandated portfolio and in turn the probability of capital loss (permanent/temporary) is less likely. However, expected potential long term investment returns could be lower over the medium to long term

Moderate | Moderate-Aggressive: These portfolios generally hold more equity exposure than low risk portfolios but less than high risk portfolios. In turn the expected volatility is higher than low risk portfolios, but less than high risk portfolios. The probability of losses are higher than that of the low risk portfolios, but less than high risk portfolios. Expected potential long term investment returns could therefore be lower than high risk portfolios due to lower equity exposure, but higher than low risk portfolios.
