

Investment objective

The fund is designed to maximise long-term capital growth by providing investors with diversified exposure to global equity markets outside South Africa. The portfolio aims to achieve its objective through participation in international equity opportunities, with a focus on delivering strong real returns over extended investment horizons.

Investment policy

The Adviceworx Global Equity Prescient Fund of Funds aims to maximise growth over the long term by investing in global equity markets. A portion of the underlying portfolios will track global world indices which ensures greater consistency and efficiency for investors. The indexation allocation of the portfolio is complemented by selecting high-conviction active international asset managers with proven track records and differentiated investment styles.

This fund follows a multi-manager strategy, investing in a blend of investment styles and managers.

Risk profile: Maximum (High Risk)

Investors should have an investment horizon of at least 10 years and be comfortable with substantial short-term volatility. The portfolio invests predominantly in global equities and is exposed to market, currency, geopolitical and economic risks across international markets. While periods of capital loss may occur over shorter timeframes, the fund is positioned for investors focused on long-term wealth accumulation.

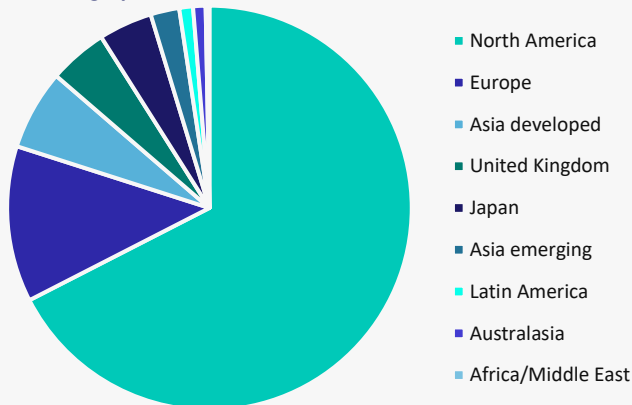
Investor suitability

International market commentary

Global equity markets were largely unchanged in July, although performance beneath the surface told a more nuanced story. Investor enthusiasm around artificial intelligence and related capital expenditure themes came under greater scrutiny during the month, prompting a rotation away from some of the market's strongest performers. The MSCI All Country World Index delivered a return of 0.1% in July, taking its year-to-date gain to 11.3%, while the 12-month return reached an impressive 22% in US dollar terms despite a backdrop of elevated geopolitical uncertainty and ongoing macroeconomic challenges.

One of the more notable developments during the month was the continued shift in market leadership from growth to value shares. As technology stocks retreated, the growth segment of the MSCI All Country World Index declined by 3.2%, while the value segment advanced by 2.9%. This trend has been evident throughout the year, with value stocks returning 15.5% year to date compared with 8.1% for growth stocks.

Regional market performance was mixed. The US S&P 500 Index was marginally negative in July but remains firmly positive, delivering returns of 9.4% year to date and 18% over the past 12 months. In Japan, the Nikkei 225 Index experienced a sharp pullback of 8% following exceptionally strong gains earlier in the year. Even so, Japanese equities have still returned 29% year to date and an impressive 59.4% over the past year in local currency terms.

Currency markets also saw significant moves.

The Japanese yen strengthened by 3.2% against the US dollar following co-ordinated intervention efforts aimed at halting its prolonged depreciation, after briefly touching its weakest levels in four decades. The euro also gained ground, appreciating 0.9% against the dollar to end the month at \$1.15. Supported by improving economic sentiment and easing inflation pressures, the Euro Stoxx 600 Index advanced 1.3% during July and delivered a strong 12-month return of 22.6% in euro terms.

Emerging market equities faced a more challenging environment. Although markets such as Brazil, India and China delivered positive returns, these gains were outweighed by weakness in South Korea, where semiconductor-related shares retraced following a powerful rally earlier in the year. As a result, the MSCI Emerging Markets Index declined by 3% in July.

Nevertheless, the asset class continues to outperform developed markets over the longer term, having returned 36.4% in US dollars over the past 12 months.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a fund less its liabilities.

Total Expense Ratio (TER%): The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the Financial Product.

Transaction Costs (TC%): The Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the net asset value of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the Financial Product.

Total Investment Charges TIC (%) = TER (%) + TC (%): The Total Investment Charges (TIC), the TER + the TC, is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the investment of the Financial Product. It should be noted that a TIC is the sum of two calculated ratios (TER+TC).
