Fund Objective

The objective of the Fund is to maintain a high level of liquidity, preserve capital and provide a return in line with US Treasury money market rates.

Investment Strategy

The Investment Manager, on behalf of the Fund, combines a relative value approach (i.e. where an asset's value is determined by taking into account the value of similar assets, looking for those that are "mispriced" relative to each other and aiming at exploiting such pricing discrepancies for the benefit of the Fund) to investing with credit quality analysis (as described in the "Credit Quality Assessment" section of the Prospectus) to identify securities that it believes will provide the greatest stability of capital and the highest probability of repayment, consistent with the Fund's investment objective.

Investments will be purchased with the intention that they will be held until maturity although the Investment Manager may, in its sole discretion, not hold investments to maturity.

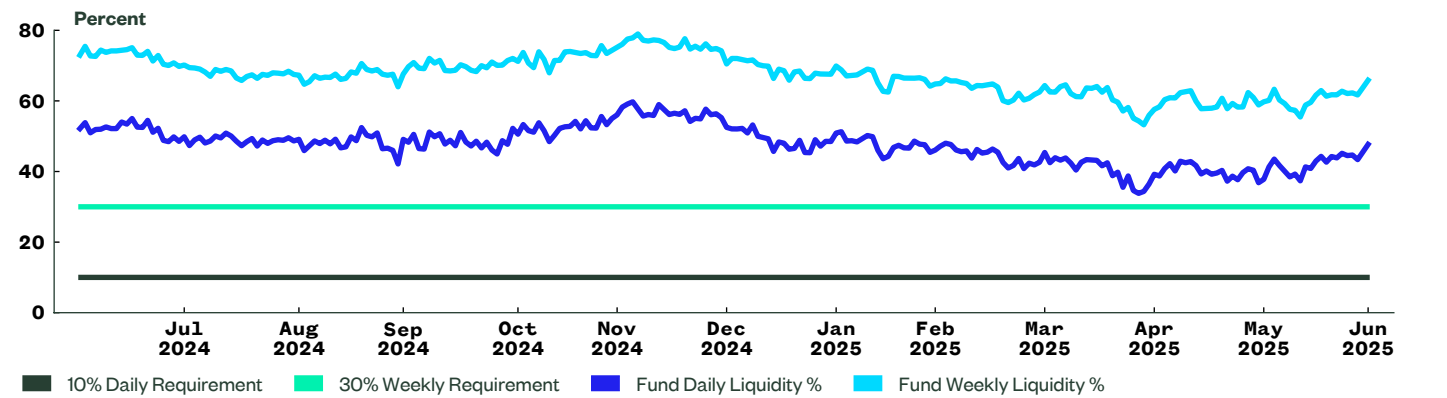

Securities that will mature (or are subject to a demand feature that is exercisable and payable) within five business days, or proceeds of pending sales of portfolio securities due within five business days.

Risk Disclaimer The risk category above is not a measure of capital loss or gains but of how significant the rises and falls in the Fund's return have been historically. Why is the Fund in this category? The Fund is in risk category 1 as its return has experienced relatively low rises and falls historically.

Liquidity Risk: Lack of a ready market or restrictions on resale may limit the ability of the Fund to sell a security at an advantageous time or price or at all. Illiquid securities may trade at a discount from comparable, more liquid investments and may be subject to wide fluctuations in market value. Illiquidity of the Fund's holdings may limit the ability of the Fund to obtain cash to meet redemptions on a timely basis.

Credit Risk: The value of debt securities that the Fund purchases may be impacted by the ability of the issuer of those securities to pay the amounts of interest and principal owed as they become

due. An actual or perceived decline in creditworthiness of an issuer of debt securities held by the Fund may result in a decrease in the value of the relevant securities.

U.S. Treasury Risk: U.S. Treasury obligations may differ from other fixed income securities in their interest rates, maturities, times of issuance and other characteristics. Glossary

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1-year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Dividend Yield: The weighted average dividend yield of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The dividend yield of each company is the dividends per share divided by the price.

Important Information

Collective Investment Schemes in Securities (CIS) should be considered as medium to long-term investments. Forward pricing is used. The Fund's Total Expense Ratio (TER) reflects the percentage of the average Net Asset Value (NAV) of the portfolio that was incurred as charges, levies and fees related to the management of the portfolio. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TERs. During the phase in period TERs do not include information gathered over a full year. Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's

underlying assets. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

Funds are priced at daily market close.

A **Money Market portfolio** is not a bank deposit account and the price is targeted at a constant value. The total return is made up of interest received and any gain or loss made on any particular instrument; and in most cases the return will have the effect of increasing or decreasing the daily yield, but in the case of abnormal losses it can have the effect of reducing the capital value of the portfolio. The yield is calculated as a weighted average yield of each underlying instrument in the portfolio. Excessive withdrawals from the portfolio may place the portfolio under liquidity pressures and a process of ring-fencing of withdrawal instructions and managed pay-outs over time may be followed.

The performance for each period shown reflects the return for investors who have been fully invested for that period.
