INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to consistently achieve returns above the (ASISA) South African General Equity category over the medium to long term. The Fund is managed systematically to outperform the peer group average return whilst maintaining similar risk characteristics.

INVESTMENT PROCESS

The Fund uses quantitative techniques to dynamically construct a portfolio that is most representative of the general equity category average then employs uncorrelated return enhancement techniques combined with efficient and cost-effective portfolio construction methods to generate outperformance. Although the fund is always fully exposed to the equity market, the use of fixed interest portable alpha techniques to enhance returns can provide exposure to cash and money market instruments, which are uncorrelated and reliable sources of additional return.

WHO SHOULD INVEST

Investors seeking broad based exposure to the South African equity market with consistently above average returns. This Fund is appropriate for investors with a long-term investment horizon.

RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

These portfolios typically hold meaningful equity and/or offshore exposure which may result in significant capital volatility over all periods. Due to their nature expected long term returns are higher than for the other risk categories.

FUND COMMENTARY

Trade policy uncertainty, war in the Middle East, moderating growth expectations, and shifting monetary policy remained central to market performance during the second quarter of 2025. Developed Market equities delivered robust gains, with the MSCI World Index rising 4.3% in June to close the quarter 11.5% higher, supported by resilient corporate earnings, stabilising economic data, and growing market confidence.

The S&P 500 Index advanced 5.1% in June, lifting quarterly returns to 10.9%, as investor sentiment improved on signs of easing inflation pressures, a resilient labour market, and continued strength in consumer spending, even as the Federal Reserve remained cautious on the timing of interest rate cuts. A strong rebound in the technology sector further supported US equities, underpinned by continued investment in AI and robust corporate balance sheets.

European equities continued to outperform, supported by an improving economic outlook as recession fears receded, inflation continued to moderate, and the ECB delivered further rate cuts to support growth. The Euro Stoxx Index gained 3.0% in June, delivering a strong 14.6% for the quarter and an impressive 28.9% year-to-date, driven by cyclical sectors and renewed investor optimism.

Asian markets also delivered strong returns, with the Nikkei 225 Index advancing 6.4% in June and 18.1% for the quarter, supported by robust corporate earnings and increased capital expenditure by domestic firms. In China, the CSI 300 Index rose 3.0% in June, closing the quarter 2.6% higher, as targeted stimulus measures in infrastructure and technology sectors provided support, although consumer confidence remained fragile.

Emerging markets outperformed, with the MSCI Emerging Markets Index climbing 6.0% in June and 12.0% for the quarter, supported by attractive valuations, moderating US dollar strength, and early signs of stabilisation in key economies, including India and Brazil, where domestic demand remained resilient.

Locally, the South African equity market benefited from the global risk-on environment, resilient commodity prices, and favourable sector dynamics, despite ongoing domestic fiscal and political uncertainties. The basic materials sector continued to lead, advancing 4.4% in June and 9.4% over the quarter, bringing year-to-date gains to 42.1%, supported by stable demand for key industrial commodities. Technology counters delivered strong performance, gaining 6.8% for the month and 20.8% for the quarter, reflecting alignment with global technology momentum and investment flows. Financials posted more modest returns of 1.2% in June and 8.5% for the quarter, supported by stable demand and attractive valuations despite domestic macro uncertainties. The rand gained 1.6% against the US dollar in June but remained weaker over the quarter (-3.3%) and year-to-date (-6.0%) as global interest rate differentials and domestic political dynamics continued to influence currency movements.

The top contributors to the Fund's performance for the month were Naspers (7.3%), MTN (12.7%) and Impala (23.1%). Detractors included Standard Bank (-2.4%), Shoprite (-5.2%), and Harmony Gold (-4.3%).

GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Fund Specific Risks

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
