WHO SHOULD INVEST

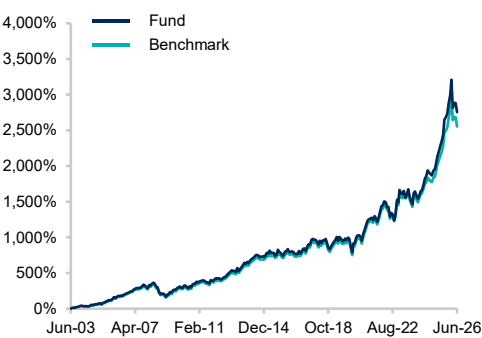
Investors seeking broad based exposure to the large capitalisation sector of the South African equity market. This Fund is appropriate for investors with a long-term investment horizon.

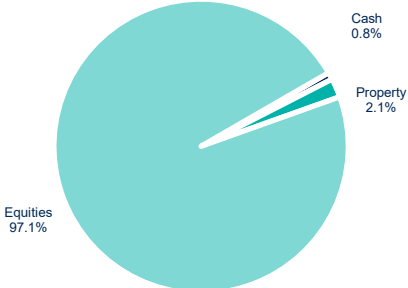
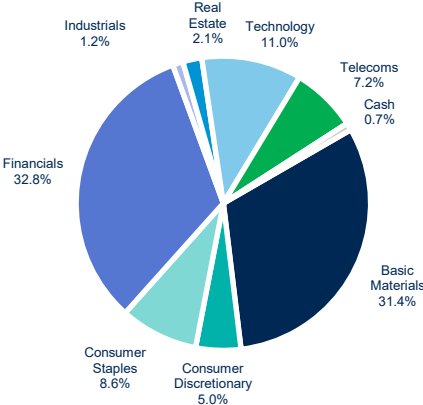

FUND COMMENTARY

Global equity markets caught their breath in June, pausing after a strong run through the second quarter rather than reversing it. The tone was one of consolidation, with investors digesting elevated valuations in the technology complex while weighing the path of inflation and monetary policy against a backdrop of still-firm commodity markets. The MSCI World Index eased 0.72% for the month, though it remains up 13.76% over the quarter and 9.69% year to date, a reminder that the recent softness sits on top of substantial earlier gains. European equities held up better, with the Euro Stoxx Index gaining 1.39% for the month and extending its year-to-date return to 8.68%, benefiting from a heavier weighting toward financials and value sectors as leadership rotated away from technology. Japan continued its remarkable run, with the Nikkei 225 rising 3.39% in June to sit 33.78% higher year to date, one of the standout performances across major markets this year.

In the United States, equity markets drifted modestly lower as investors took some profit off the technology names that had led the market higher. The S&P 500 declined 0.95% in June, trimming its year-to-date advance to 10.21%. The pullback was orderly rather than disorderly, reflecting valuation sensitivity in the growth complex more than any deterioration in underlying fundamentals.

Emerging markets softened at the margin after an exceptionally strong quarter. The MSCI Emerging Markets Index slipped 1.41% in June but remains up 24.05% over the quarter and 23.85% year to date, reflecting the scale of the earlier rally. Within China, the CSI 300 Index bucked the softer emerging market tone, gaining 1.47% for the month as domestic sentiment steadied.

Locally, South African equities came under more concentrated pressure, with the FTSE/JSE All Share Index declining 3.68% in June and slipping 2.96% year to date. The weakness was led squarely by the resources complex, with the basic materials sector falling 16.01% during the month as commodity prices retraced from elevated levels. Despite the sharp monthly move, the sector remains strongly positive over the past year, up 42.42%. Technology extended its difficult run, declining a further 3.18% in June to sit 25.52% lower year to date. Financials and property provided a counterweight, rising 2.62% and 3.74% respectively during the month, underscoring the dispersion beneath the headline index move.

Currency dynamics provided a partial offset for local investors this month. The rand weakened 1.01% against the US dollar in June, which helped cushion the rand value of offshore returns. Over the quarter, however, the currency was a headwind, having strengthened 3.26%.

Overall, June was a month of consolidation rather than distress. The broad market gave back a little of a strong quarter, with leadership rotating away from resources and technology toward financials and property. The dispersion beneath a relatively contained headline move is the real story here; parts of the market behaved very differently from one another. In an environment of shifting leadership, the case for a disciplined and diversified approach remains as relevant as ever.

The top contributors to the Fund's performance for the month were Capitec Bank Holdings (6.50%), FirstRand (5.28%) and MTN Group (5.10%). Detractors included Gold Fields (-14.11%), AngloGold Ashanti (-14.90%) and Valterra Platinum (-18.04%).

GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Dividend Yield: The weighted average dividend yield of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The dividend yield of each company is the dividends per share divided by the price.

PE Ratio: The weighted average price earnings ratio of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The price earnings ratio of each company is the price divided by the earnings per share.

Fund Specific Risks

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
