

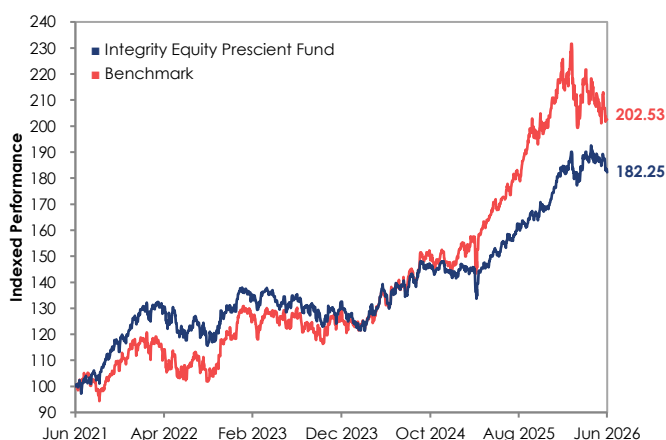

/ Portfolio description

The primary objective of the portfolio is to achieve long term capital appreciation by investing in a diversified portfolio of **South African listed equities**. The portfolio manager acquires local equities at levels below the assessment of the companies' fair values. The portfolio manager also takes cognisance of worldwide economic, sector and investment trends to tilt the portfolio towards attractive sectors and companies.

The Integrity Equity Prescient Fund is required to invest a minimum of 80% of the portfolio in equities and is therefore suitable for investors with an investment horizon of five years or longer.

Integrity diligently follows a **value investment philosophy and process**. This is the same investment philosophy and process applied in managing the Integrity Local Equity Strategy, with track record since 5 August 2011.

The portfolio has adhered to its policy objective since its inception.

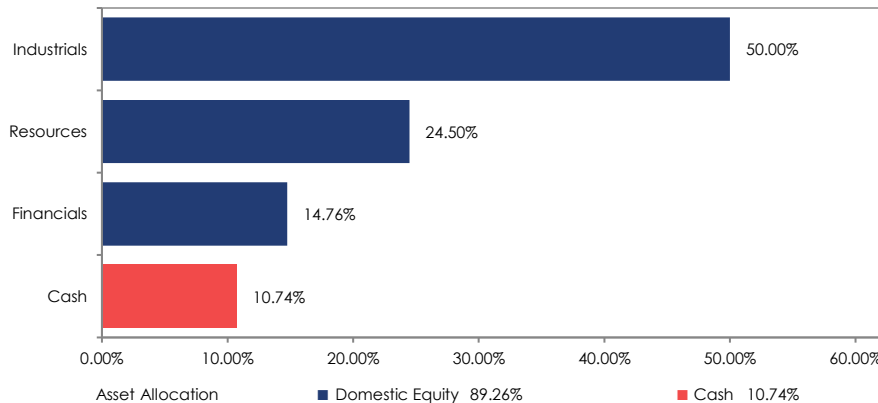

/ Relative performance

Over the quarter, the Fund generated a return of -0.27% compared to the FTSE/JSE All Share Index's total return of -2.36%. The Fund benefitted from its top performing shares over the period, namely; KAP, Oceana Group, Clientele and Aspen. Additionally, the Fund benefitted from its material underweight to the mining sector, more specifically Gold fields, Valterra Platinum and Impala Platinum. Conversely, the largest detractors from performance relative to the benchmark were the Fund's overweight positions in Spar, Sasol and TFG, which detracted 2.88% from alpha over the period. Furthermore, the Fund's underweighting to financials, specifically Capitec and FirstRand, hurt its performance during the quarter. Over the quarter, value outperformed growth, as the FTSE/JSE Growth Total Return Index decreased by -3.39% compared to a decrease of -1.27% in the FTSE/JSE Value Total Return Index. Considering the current macro backdrop, the Investment Manager expects value to continue outperforming growth in the future as fundamentals regain focus.

/ Fund composition

Over the quarter, the Investment Manager decreased exposure to counters that performed well, namely Remgro, Anglo American, Sasol, AB InBev, KAP, Glencore, Oceana, and Satrix FINI. The Investment Manager increased exposure to AngloGold Ashanti, TFG, Mondi, and Prosus. Additionally, the Investment Manager initiated new positions in Harmony and Gold Fields. There were no complete exits during the quarter. Furthermore, the share repurchase offer by Clientele was accepted and concluded during the quarter. The above portfolio changes and market movements resulted in an increase in cash exposure from 4.79% to 10.74%. The Resources allocation decreased from 26.33% to 24.50%, Industrials allocation decreased from 54.53% to 50.00%, and the Financials allocation increased from 14.35% to 14.76%.

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/ Glossary

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer-term performance rescaled to a 1-year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest return: The highest and lowest returns for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The Net Asset Value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Risk profile: A measure of the volatility of the fund and volatility is a statistical measure of the dispersion of returns for a given security. Low risk portfolios indicates less volatility with potentially lower returns and high risk portfolios indicates more volatility with potentially higher returns. High risk portfolios generally hold more equity exposure than any other risk portfolios and therefore tend to carry higher volatility.
