The portfolio is constructed in a diversified manner and aims to provide competitive after inflation annualized returns measured in rand over a 5 year period.


Investment Policy

The fund invests in a diversified combination of worldwide assets including, equities, bonds, property, preference shares, money market instruments, listed and unlisted financial instruments. The fund may also invest in other collective investment schemes, exchange traded funds or other similar schemes. The manager may combine the experience, skills and diverse strategies within Fairtree Asset Management with external managers in order to enhance the risk return outcome for investors. The fund includes and utilises the Smart Beta multi factor approach that refers to a passive style systemic solution. The Smart Beta multi factor approach entails efficient transformation of information into investment decisions, based on a well researched, transparent and consistent set of theoretically and empirically verified factors such as quality, value, momentum, investment and volatility. The manager has maximum flexibility without any worldwide asset allocation and strategy constraints. The fund is benchmark agnostic in order to maximise returns for the South African investor.


RISK INDICATOR





MARKET COMMENTARY

November was an outstanding month for markets as equities and bonds posted strong returns on the back of a growing "soft landing" narrative. Economic data is weakening but remains strong enough to allay recession fears while inflation continues to trend lower. With policy rates well within restrictive territory, expectations are building that central banks will be able to cut rates next year and thereby engineer a soft landing. US 10yr bond yields dropped 0.7% over the month and the curve started to steepen towards month end as market moved to price in rates cuts by the ECB and Fed in April and May next year. The drop in US yields was primarily driven by lower real rates which also caused the US dollar to weaken around 3% over the month and the gold price to pierce through the

We continue to anticipate a mild recession outcome for the US economy which may force the Fed to ultimately cut interest rates, potentially more than its peers. We believe Europe is already experiencing a mild recession. Softer growth from these developed nations will be offset by higher growth from China where authorities have announced several fiscal and property sector related measures to support the economy. These measures will benefit infrastructure and property activity over coming quarters. We expect more policy easing from Chinese policy makers to shore up consumer and business confidence.

Geopolitical risk in the Middle East remains elevated while the Taiwan election results will be a key determined of the sustainability of the détente between the US and China reached post the Biden-Xi meeting last month. There are also growing concerns that production cuts discipline amongst OPEC+ members may be waning in the face of record oil production by the US and softer growth.

In SA economic activity has remained weak dragged down by ongoing electricity cuts and logistical concerns. Consumers are feeling the pinch from higher rates and are pulling back on credit extension and consumption. Headline inflation has surged on the back of higher food prices while core inflation remains close to the mid-point of the target range.

In terms of performance, global equities rose 9.4% while Emerging Markets rose 8%. Chinese equities were up 2.5% and South African 8.3%. Global government bonds rose 5% while South African government bonds were up 4.7%. Within commodities, oil declined 5.5%% while copper rose 4.5%, iron ore rose 5.5%, gold rose 2.7% and palladium and platinum fell -10% and 0.8%.

Equities: Tight financial conditions and slow growth will weigh on valuations, profit margins and earnings. US valuations and earnings estimates remains elevated. We prefer South Africa and emerging market equities with better valuations, less exposure to inflation risks and more exposure to a China recovery and the potential to cut rates. We increased exposure to defensive sectors and securities. We like resources and non-resource Rand hedge exposure like global consumer and industrial stocks.

Fixed Income: Local bond yields are attractive. Local core inflation remains contained but upside risks are high. Headline inflation has peaked, and we expect the SARB to cut rates next year. The sovereign credit premium remains elevated. Global developed market bonds remain attractive given the outlook for softer growth.

Currency: We expect US dollar upside to be limited and should see a weakening bias over coming quarters given its over valuation status, weak twin deficit fundamentals and expected peak in Fed policy rates.

Annualised Performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual Annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest Performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Sortino Ratio: A measure of the risk-adjusted return of a portfolio. It is a modification of the Sharpe ratio but only penalises the returns falling below a user specified target, or required rate of

return, while the Sharpe ratio penalises both upside and downside volatility equally. Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return. High Water Mark: The highest level of performance achieved over a specified period.

Total Expense Ratio (TER%): The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the Financial Product.

Performance fee incl. in TER (%) PF (%): The Performance Fee is a payment made to the Fund Manager for generating positive returns and is generally calculated as percentage of investment

profits, often both realized and unrealized.

Transaction Costs (TC%): The Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the net asset value of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying

Total Investment Charges TIC (%) = TER (%) + TC (%):The Total Investment Charges (TIC), the TER + the TC, is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the investment of the Financial Product. It should be noted that a TIC is the sum of two calculated ratios (TER+TC).

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.

The portfolio has adhered to its object and there were no material changes to the composition of the portfolio during the quarter.

Risk Indicator Definition

The Portfolio is more diversified than the benchmark, thus holding smaller positions in the largest capitalisation stocks than the benchmark. This comes with the risk of more volatile relative returns to the broader market when the largest stocks in the benchmark outperform. We believe however that this strategy of holding a more diversified portfolio results in lower single stock risk, and whilst there may be periods of underperformance when the large cap stocks rally, we firmly believe in efficient risk management on an absolute basis. The strategy is also exposed to various factors driving investment performance, for example Value and Momentum, and these factors may also experience periods of relative underperformance. Global research has shown however, that consistent long term exposure to these factors lead to investment reward. This portfolio is permitted to invest in foreign securities which may have additional risks (FX Movements for example). However, the portfolio does not currently hold any foreign securities and the manager does not intend on exposing the portfolio to any foreign securities going forward.
