

# PRESCIENT INCOME PLUS FUND (A2)

## MINIMUM DISCLOSURE DOCUMENT & GENERAL INVESTOR REPORT

### INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to return STeFi Call + 3% per annum through a full interest rate cycle by offering investors an enhanced income yield without undue risk on capital by maintaining constrained credit risk exposure.

### INVESTMENT PROCESS

The Fund invests in a diversified portfolio consisting primarily of South African vanilla debt, mezzanine and structured instruments across the term structure and credit rating bands. Portfolio risk is managed at both single issuer and portfolio level. The former is done through an inhouse dynamic probability of default (PD) based rating model and the latter is through measuring the Expected Loss (EL), Loss Given Default (LGD) and credit VaR (Value at Risk). The Fund's modified duration will typically be below two years. Credit asset selection is underpinned by minimising default risk and credit spread duration.

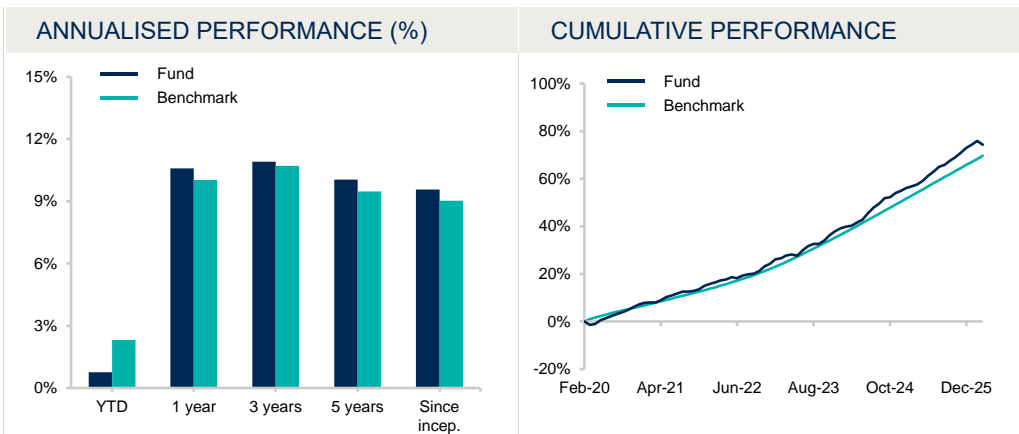
### WHO SHOULD INVEST

Investors seeking performance in excess of what is available in the money market or a typical income fund. The Fund is Regulation 28 compliant.

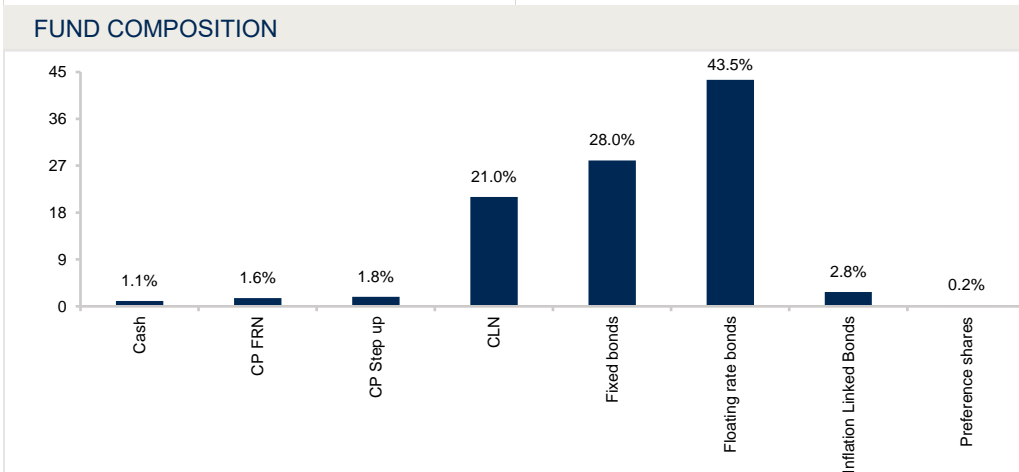
### RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

This portfolio typically has longer dated and complex credit exposures, resulting in some capital volatility and liquidity constraints to investors over the shorter term. It is managed in such a manner that the probability of capital losses over one-year periods is unlikely, and in a manner that would cater for client redemptions appropriately.

## FUND COMMENTARY

In March, the U.S. Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) kept interest rates unchanged for the second consecutive meeting, maintaining the federal funds rate at 3.50%–3.75%. The U.S.-Iran conflict dominated the global backdrop, with the FOMC acknowledging that the economic implications remain uncertain. The dot plot continued to signal one cut expected in 2026.

Locally, the SARB left the repo rate unchanged at 6.75% at its March Monetary Policy Committee meeting. The decision was unanimous, a shift from January's 4-2 split, reflecting the more uncertain global environment. While February CPI printed at the 3% midpoint of the SARB's target range, the bank warned that fuel-driven inflation could accelerate in the near term, with rate cuts now taken off the table for 2026. The local market adjusted over the month to now price in two rate hikes by end-2026, reflecting the anticipated pass-through of higher oil prices.

Debt Capital Market (DCM) activity remained robust in March, with R24.9bn of issuance, well ahead of the R14.6bn seen in February (March 2025: R12.7bn). Both FirstRand Bank Ltd and Nedbank Group completed their inaugural FLAC auctions during the month, raising R3.0bn each, bringing total FLAC issuance for March to R6.0bn. Further notable issuance from the banking sector includes Absa Group Ltd raising R3.3bn in Additional Tier 1 paper and R2.4bn in Tier 2 paper, and FirstRand Bank Ltd raising R2.5bn in senior notes. Outside of the banking sector, Life Healthcare raised R1.5bn, Daimler Truck Southern Africa raised R1.0bn, and Pepkor Holdings Ltd raised R1.1bn in senior unsecured paper. Year-to-date term issuance stands at R41.7bn, compared to R25.5bn over the same period last year.

Regarding our view on credit markets, our theme is determined by a combination of the output of our Credit Cycle Indicator (CCI), consideration of individual counterparty default probabilities, and the yields offered on these opportunities. Our CCI suggests continued heightened risk levels inherent in the South African Credit market, and the Fund's positioning emphasizes holding assets with defensive characteristics, while opportunistically taking on additional risk as deemed appropriate.

The Fund delivered a net return of -93 basis points over the month, against the benchmark return of 81 basis points. As at month-end, the Fund's gross yield was 10.19%, with a modified duration of 1.70 and a weighted term to maturity of 6.4 years.

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## GLOSSARY

**Annualised performance:** Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

**Highest & Lowest performance:** The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

**NAV:** The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

**Current Yield:** Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

**CPU:** Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

**Alpha:** Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

**Sharpe Ratio:** The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

**Standard Deviation:** The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

**Max Drawdown:** The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

**% Positive Month:** The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

**Average Duration:** The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund.

**Forward Yield:** The Forward Yield is the expected combined income of the instruments in the portfolio over the next year expressed as a percentage of the current value of those instruments.

## Fund Specific Risks

**Default Risk:** The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.

**Derivatives risk:** The use of derivatives could increase overall risk by magnifying the effect of both gains and losses in a Fund. As such, large changes in value and potentially large financial losses could result.
