To provide stable capital growth to investors over the long-term and target returns of CPI+2% over rolling 3-year periods. This fund is well diversified across asset classes and global markets, cautiously managed with a higher exposure to income investments.

- The multi-asset portfolio is well diversified and cautiously managed to ensure less volatility, it is largely invested in interest bearing and income related asset classes.
- It is diversified across global and local asset classes into interest bearing, income and equities as diversification supports risk management.

FUND COMMENTARY

This conservatively and cautiously managed Fund continues to deliver according to its mandate, producing positive returns at low volatility. The Fund is widely diversified and holds less than 40% in equities, with most assets invested in cash and income asset classes. The lower exposure to the strong performing global equity asset class resulted in its performance being much lower than that of a typical balanced or global equity fund. The Fairtree Select Cautious fund and Laurium Stable fund continue to deliver risk-adjusted performance. The Old Mutual Stable Growth fund and SA Govi ETF were a drag on investment returns during the quarter.

The global economy remains resilient with projected real GDP growth in the US of 2.1%. The market envisioned a soft-landing scenario in the US, which drove equity markets higher. The MSCI World index was up almost 9% in USD, mainly driven by technology stocks in the USA while developing countries only added 2.4% growth.

Locally, our equity and bond markets experienced declines and were down more than 2% over the quarter. Despite this, we have seen a strong recovery in resource counters since March.

In the coming quarter, South Africans will be heading to voting stations to cast their votes in the most contested election since 1994. Various diverging outcomes scenarios are being tabled, ranging from very bad to very good with the stakes remaining high.

We continue to diversify your assets across asset classes, regions and sectors, considering not only returns, but risks as well.

GLOSSARY

Annualised Performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any I year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Total Expense Ratio (TER%): The Total Expense Ratio (TER) is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the Financial Product.
