MONTHLY COMMENTARY

The CGGF NAV per share rose +2.9%, while the Morningstar Aggressive Allocation peer group advanced +2.3%. Global equities performed strongly in February with the MSCI All Country World index rising +4.2%. Large-cap technology stocks continued to produce outsized gains, however, the rally has broadened out, as seen by a rebound in the MSCI World equal-weight index (+4.3%).

US markets continue to lead year-to-date performance, with the S&P500 advancing +5.2% in February, followed closely by the European Stoxx 50 (+4.5%). UK (-0.8%) and Swiss (-1.8%) markets declined in USD terms. Chinese equities (+9.1%) rebounded strongly, rising for the first time in four months on hopes of government stimulus to support the alling economy. On a sectoral basis, Consumer Discretionary (+7.7%) outperformed as online as well as brick-and-mortar retailers reported better-than-expected results. Information Technology (+6.1%) continued to push higher, boosted by strong company results and optimism around Artificial Intelligence opportunities. Consumer Staples (+0.4%) lagged, with more mixed results from underlying companies, while Utilities (-0.8%) was the only sector to trade lower in the month.

Global Manufacturing remains in recession, with stable but contractionary PMIs in the EU (46.5) and China (49.1), and a further decline in the US (47.8). The larger services sector expanded for the first time in seven months in the EU (50.2) while slowing but still expanding in the US (52.6). The US economy added more jobs than expected last month (+275 000), however, previous months' figures were revised lower. The unemployment rate (3.9%) rose slightly but remains near historic lows, while wage growth was strong (+3.9%). Wage growth is feeding into inflation (3.2%), which remains above target levels.

The largest positive contributor to the Fund's performance was Nvidia, with a staggering run that has seen the company add \$800 billion to its market value in the first two months of 2024. Meta Platforms also rallied sharply following robust results earlier in the month. The largest negative contributor to performance was Adobe, falling on concerns about Al competition (text-to-video technologies) to one of the company's products. Adobe, however, is rolling out its own Al-driven features. Heineken also traded sharply lower as challenges in key emerging markets, Nigeria and Vietnam, weighed on results.

The Fund initiated a new position in Mastercard, a duopoly player in global payment networks. Mastercard is an exceptionally high quality company, with a dominant market position and a long record of producing high sustainable growth rates. The Fund exited the position in Alibaba due to revived regulatory risk for Chinese technology companies and sold the Government bond ETF as a funding source for equity positions.

At the end of the month the Fund had an underlying exposure to equities of 90.3%, property 3.6%, and cash 6.1%.





FUND ASSET ALLOCATION




NET CURRENCY EXPOSURE
