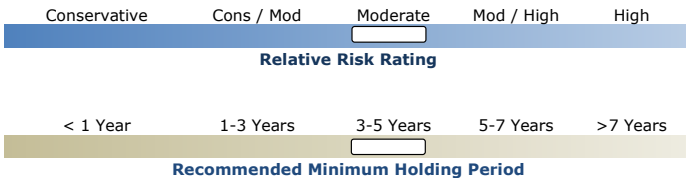

Investor Profile

The Fund is suitable for individuals, charities, trusts and companies that seek an actively managed balanced portfolio which invests in direct equity instruments and collective investment schemes, both locally and offshore. The Fund is subject to currency risk as a result. The Fund is suitable for retirement funding purposes as a stand-alone option and complies with Reg 28.



Investment Objective and Strategy

The objective of the Fund is to achieve total returns in excess of the composite benchmark over the medium-term, whilst actively managing capital through economic cycles. The real-return reference is SA CPI+4% per annum.

The Fund will invest in equity, cash, bond, credit, alternative and property instruments as well as 3rd party funds and other instruments as determined by the Authority from time to time that conform with the Fund objectives.

The Fund will be positioned according to the portfolio manager's assessment of prevailing investment prospects for each asset class and when deemed appropriate, the portfolio manager may invest up to 45% in offshore assets and up to a maximum of 75% of the portfolio in equities in line with Regulation 28 parameters.

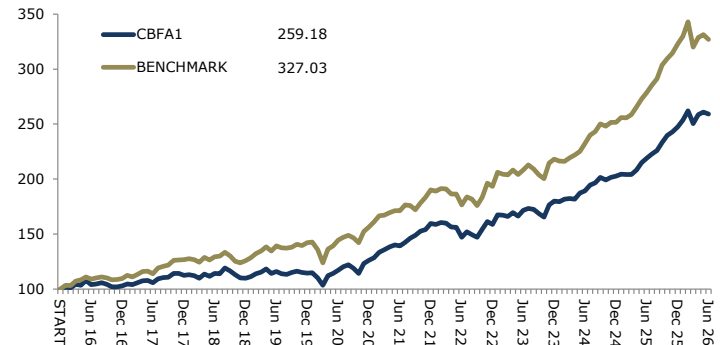

Value of R100 invested at inception, income reinvested. NAV-NAV



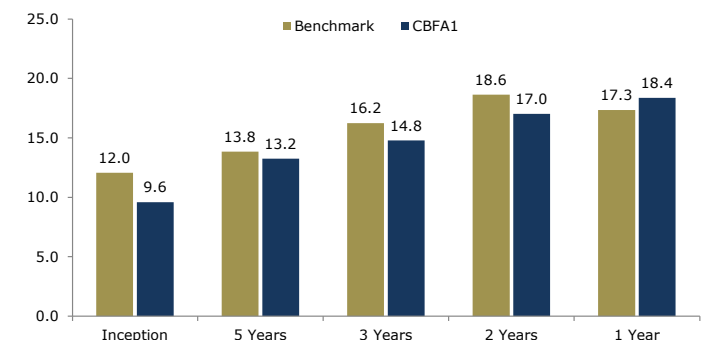

The Fund's **Total Expense Ratio (TER)** reflects the percentage of the average Net Asset Value (NAV) of the portfolio that was incurred as charges, levies and fees related to the management of the portfolio. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TER's. **Transaction Costs (TC)** is the percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's underlying assets. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. The **Total Investment Charge (TIC)** should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager.

Performance has been calculated using net NAV to NAV numbers with income reinvested. The performance for each period shown reflects the return for investors who have been fully invested for that period. Individual investor performance may differ as a result of initial fees, the actual investment date, the date of reinvestments and dividend withholding tax. 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Medium / Moderate Risk Portfolios: Generally, these portfolios hold more equity and offshore exposure than lower risk portfolios and less equity and less offshore exposure than higher risk portfolios.

Glossary

Annualised performance:

An annualised total return is the geometric average amount of money earned by an investment each year over a given time period. It is calculated as a geometric average to show what an investor would earn over a period of time if the annual return was compounded.

NAV:

The Net Asset Value (NAV) represents the assets of the Fund less its liabilities.

Highest / Lowest 1 year return:

These figures represent the highest and lowest rolling 12-month returns on each unit class of the Fund since inception.

Medium Risk Portfolios:

Generally, these portfolios hold more equity and offshore exposure than lower risk portfolios (thereby showing a higher level of volatility) and less equity and less offshore exposure than higher risk portfolios (thereby showing a lower level of volatility in returns over the recommended holding period).

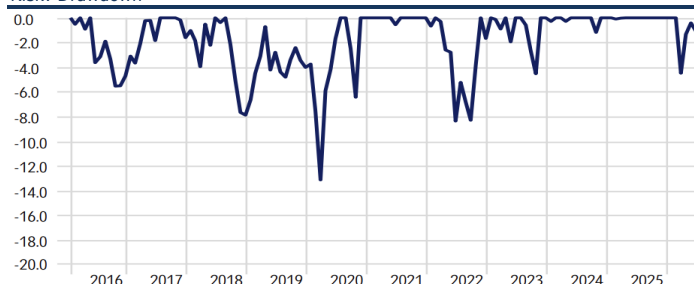

Activity during the quarter

SA Bond exposure was increased early in the period as yields rose and maintained on rate and inflation concerns. Precious metal positions were trimmed through the sale of Northam Platinum and a reduction in AngloGold on higher rates being maintained globally. In line with our stock selection process applied across all Cordatus Funds relatively expensive ING Group was sold, while Microsoft and Shell were introduced given the relatively attractive valuations at which they were trading.

Contributions to Fund quarterly return

The % NAV figure alongside measures the average stock / Fund holding over the quarter. Local equities lagged as global markets made a strong recovery following the large March drawdown. The SARB hiked rates during the quarter given the potential for inflation to rise materially relative to the new target rate of 3%. The ZAR appreciated 4.1% against a moderately stronger USD during the period, muting offshore bond and cash returns, while lower commodity and precious metals impacted negatively on SA equity positions.

Changes in asset allocation

The Fund saw a net reduction in equity exposure because of the sale / reductions mentioned above, while longer-dated duration was increased from the sale proceeds. Geographic allocation remains unchanged within Fund. We are comforted by the level of dry powder (cash and short-dated income) at our disposal currently as we enter another uncertain period in the quarter ahead. Our concerns around US (and others) debt levels and the implications for inflation, yields, leverage and inflated stock valuations going into the period under review have not changed.

A note on portfolio risk

Drawdown measures the peak-to-trough decline during a specific period, quoted as a percentage between the latest peak and subsequent trough of the Fund, before a new peak is achieved. It is instructive when measuring the loss to the portfolio during a period and the subsequent return required to return to the previous peak of the portfolio. The drawdown profile shown alongside depicts Fund reaction to events since inception. Asset allocation intervention during such periods is necessary to compress the recovery time factor and/or limit further downside. The appropriate period over which to measure performance of the Fund is rolling 3-year periods, given the risk profile and recommended holding period. Shorter measurement periods are linked to a higher variance in returns.

Adherence to Fund Policy Objective

The Fund has adhered to its Policy Objective, as stated in the Supplemental Deed, in all respects during the quarter. There are no unresolved breaches to report from prior periods.
