INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to deliver returns close to the FTSE/JSE Africa Shareholder Weighted Total Return Index at low cost. Although the Fund is structured similarly to the SWIX, it can out / underperform the SWIX by small amounts over time.

INVESTMENT PROCESS

The Fund follows an investment policy which firstly endeavours to follow the composition of the SWIX closely and secondly seeks enhancement opportunities to secure for investors an optimum overall return. In addition to investing in physical assets, the Fund can use derivatives to create exposure to the SWIX or subsets thereof in a low cost and efficient manner.

WHO SHOULD INVEST

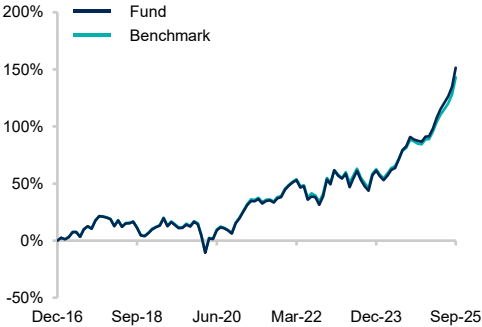
Investors who are seeking long term capital growth through exposure to the South Africa equity market by investing in a fund with a low tracking error relative to the SWIX and who are cost conscious.

RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

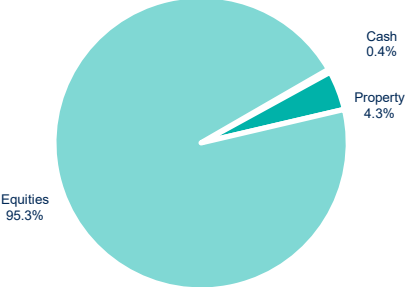

FUND COMMENTARY

After a volatile start to September, global equity markets ended the third quarter of 2025 on a steadier footing as the MSCI World Index advanced 3.2% for the month and 7.3% for the quarter. This was seemingly on the back of renewed confidence in a soft-landing narrative, resilient corporate earnings, and optimism around potential U.S. Federal Reserve rate cuts later this year. In the U.S., the S&P 500 added 3.6% in September, capping an 8.1% gain for the quarter as market participants digested a mixed set of macro indicators; softer manufacturing data offset by continued labour-market strength while the Fed kept rates unchanged but signalled increasing comfort with disinflation progress. Large-cap technology shares regained leadership of this charge, supported by robust demand for AI-related infrastructure and cloud computing investment.

European equities also ended higher, with the Euro Stoxx 500 up 3.3% for the month and 4.1% for the quarter. Improving business sentiment and easing inflation provided some relief, while the European Central Bank maintained a measured tone on future rate cuts. UK Equities were similarly strong, despite sticky inflation data and political uncertainty, the FTSE 100 Index gained 1.5% and 5.5% for the month and quarter respectively. In Asia, Japan's Nikkei 225 Index gained 4.6% in U.S. dollars for September to post a quarterly gain of 8.3%, as a weaker yen propped up the export market outlook and buoyed investor optimism. China's CSI 300 Index, led by the technology sector gained 3.3% to extend its quarterly rally to a massive 18.6% amid targeted policy stimulus and early signs of stabilisation in the property sector.

Emerging-market equities outperformed developed market equities, with the MSCI EM Index up 7.2% for September and 10.6% for the quarter. Gains were driven by stronger performance from China, India, and select Southeast Asian markets, even as Latin America lagged on currency volatility and fiscal pressures.

South African equities followed the global trend. The FTSE/JSE All Share Index rose 6.6% in September and 12.9% for the quarter, supported by strength in resources and technology shares. The rand strengthened 2.2% against the U.S. dollar during the month to close the quarter 2.5% stronger than the greenback.

The top contributors to the Fund's performance for the month were Gold Fields (27.1%), Valterra Platinum Ltd (52.9%) and Anglogold Ashanti Plc (23.2%). Detractors included British American Tobacco PLC (-8.6%), Sanlam Ltd (-8.3%), and Discovery Ltd (-9.2%).

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GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Dividend Yield: The weighted average dividend yield of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The dividend yield of each company is the dividends per share divided by the price.

PE Ratio: The weighted average price earnings ratio of all the underlying equity in the Fund. The price earnings ratio of each company is the price divided by the earnings per share.

Fund Specific Risks

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.

Derivatives risk: The use of derivatives could increase overall risk by magnifying the effect of both gains and losses in a Fund. As such, large changes in value and potentially large financial losses could result.

Interest rate risk: The value of fixed income investments (e.g. bonds) tends to be inversely related to interest and inflation rates. Hence their value decreases when interest rates and/or inflation rises.

% Property risk: Investments in real estate securities can carry the same risks as investing directly in real estate itself. Real estate prices move in response to a variety of factors, including local, regional and national economic and political conditions, interest rates and tax considerations.

Derivative counterparty risk: A counterparty to a derivative transaction may experience a breakdown in meeting its obligations thereby leading to financial loss.

Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's underlying assets. Transaction cost is a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

Where a current yield has been included for Funds that derive its income primarily from interest bearing income, the yield is a weighted average yield of all underlying interest bearing instruments as at the last day of the month. This yield is subject to change as market rates and underlying investments change.
