INVESTMENT AND RETURN OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to achieve returns above the STeFI Call Index, while minimising the risk of any underperformance. Importantly, the Fund is managed conservatively and it aims to maintain capital stability and liquidity.

INVESTMENT PROCESS

The Fund invests in cash and high-quality capital market instruments. The Fund is structured to minimise the risk of not meeting the benchmark. Returns achieved above the benchmark are used in specialist strategies designed to enhance yield further.

WHO SHOULD INVEST

Investors seeking a liquid, low risk money market offering, with enhanced yields. This Fund is suitable to investors with a short-term investment horizon and is Regulation 28 compliant.

RISK INDICATOR DEFINITION

These portfolios typically have no or low equity exposure, resulting in higher interest yields and stable capital values with the probability of capital losses over the shorter term (3 months) highly unlikely. These portfolios typically target returns in the region of 1% – 3% above inflation before tax over the long term.

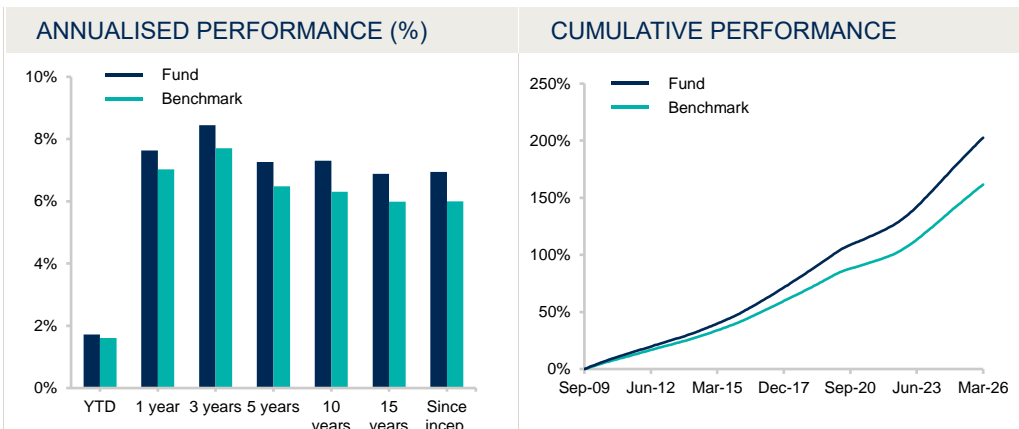

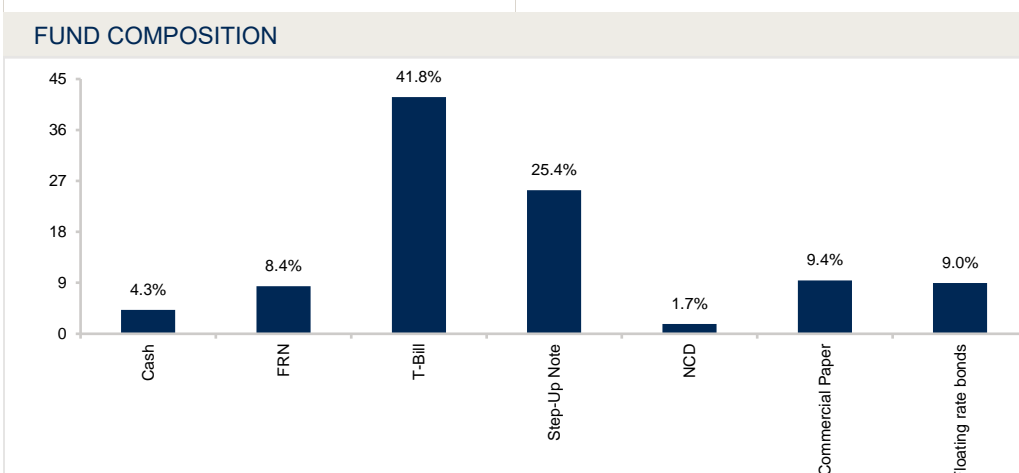

FUND COMMENTARY

During March, the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) left the target range for the federal funds rate unchanged at 3.50% - 3.75%. In its post-meeting statement, the Committee highlighted that the implications of developments in the Middle East for the US economy remain uncertain. Reflecting these risks, the updated Summary of Economic Projections now implies only one rate cut in both 2026 and 2027.

Locally, the South African Reserve Bank left interest rates unchanged in a unanimous decision and maintained a cautious stance on monetary policy. While inflation remains contained within the target band, near-term risks have shifted to the upside, particularly due to higher fuel costs and currency weakness. As a result, expectations for imminent interest rate cuts have moderated, with the policy outlook increasingly characterised by a "higher-for-longer" trajectory.

Money market conditions remained broadly stable over the period, although liquidity tightened marginally toward month-end. Short-term interest rates traded with a slight upward bias, reflecting both elevated funding demand and the repricing of inflation expectations. Yields across treasury bills and high-quality bank instruments remained attractive, continuing to support income generation within portfolios.

We have seen material shift in 1Year NCD shifting higher 77.5 basis points over the month period with 9 month Treasury bills shifting 40 basis points higher respectively.

We continue to buy Treasury bills targeting the 6 & 9 month tenor when investing in fixed assets rather than bank NCDs and continue to add credit conservatively when available in the primary or secondary market.

All asset classes contributed positively to the month's performance, with both the fixed rate exposure and high-quality floating rate corporate assets adding to our above benchmark return.

The Fund delivered strong performance in March, bolstered by positively yielding assets, which contributed to a meaningful overall return for the fund.

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GLOSSARY

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Average Duration: The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund.

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.

During the phase in period TERs do not include information gathered over a full year. Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's underlying assets. Transaction cost is a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER. A Money Market portfolio is not a bank deposit account and the price is targeted at a constant value. The total return is made up of interest received and any gain or loss made on any particular instrument; and in most cases the return will have the effect of increasing or decreasing the daily yield, but in the case of abnormal losses it can have the effect of reducing the capital value of the portfolio. The yield is calculated as a weighted average yield of each underlying instrument in the portfolio. Excessive withdrawals from the portfolio may place the portfolio under liquidity pressures and a process of ring-fencing of withdrawal instructions and managed pay-outs over time may be followed. Where a current yield has been included for Funds that derive its income primarily from interest bearing income, the yield is a weighted average yield of all underlying interest bearing instruments as at the last day of the month. This yield is subject to change as market rates and underlying investments change.
