ABOUT THE FUND

The Fund is actively managed on a discretionary basis to provide stable long-term growth with moderate level of risk. The Fund shall be within 2 years of the modified duration of the BEASSA Total Return Index.

INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The Fund aims to deliver a return in excess of the benchmark over the long term, which comprises a reasonable level of income, as well as capital performance relative to the benchmark. The portfolio will invest in interest bearing and non-equity securities (including, but not limited to, government or quasigovernment bonds, corporate bonds, cash deposits, money market and other interest-bearing securities), as well as listed and unlisted financial instruments in line with appropriate regulations. The investments are actively managed and will change over time to reflect a macro fundamental outlook including the interest rate cycle, business cycle, default cycle, as well as other cyclical and credit factors.


The portfolio has adhered to its investment objective and there were no material changes to the composition of the portfolio during the reporting period.





FUND COMMENTARY

The global economy has begun to improve but remains fragile. Despite lingering geopolitical tensions in Ukraine and the Middle East, market volatility remains broadly subdued from a historical perspective. That said, global investors remain hesitant to take on risk at a time when the Federal Reserve (Fed) still appears to be in no urgent hurry to cut U.S. policy rates. Higher-than-expected GDP and CPI data out of the US in recent months prompted Fed officials to upwardly revise their 2024 growth and inflation projections at the March FOMC meeting. Although the Mar-24 Fed dot plot still signalled 75bp worth of rate cuts in 2024, we have pencilled in only two rate cuts during 2024. Forward Rate Agreement (FRA) are now also pricing only two 25bp rate cuts from the Fed this year, compared to an expectation of five 25bp cuts at the start of the year. Analysts have also upwardly revised their US bond yield forecasts over the past month at a time when oil prices are currently trading above expectations. The unwinding of dovish US policy bets, dollar strength, and Donald Trump's resurgence are all reasons to worry about EM credit this year.

Consequently, we believe that these investors are likely to remain preoccupied with FOMC meetings and/or the outcome of any data that has a material influence on US policy rate expectations over the coming months. Any significant stimulus measures out of China and/or any global supply fears in war-torn areas could also provide a boost to commodity-exporting countries such as South Africa.

Locally, deepening logistics woes pose a downside risk to growth. Tepid growth will likely translate into government revenue underperformance, hindering the government's plans to halt the increase in debt. The central bank remains hawkish as it focuses on lowering inflation to the midpoint of its target range. We expect the SARB's first rate cut in 3Q24. The risks to our rate outlook include rand weakness and a delay in the U.S. Fed's rate cut. High-interest rates and poor job creation will keep household spending subdued. Investment is likely to remain robust owing to spending on renewable energy projects. The general elections due later this year are unlikely to bring about policy change.

GLOSSARY

- Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1-year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.
- Highest & Lowest return: The highest and lowest returns for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.
- NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.
- Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.
- Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.
- Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.
- Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month
- % Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.
- Average Duration: The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund.
- · Average Credit quality: The weighted average credit quality of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund (internally calculated).
