

Fund classification: The fund is a flexible hedge fund suitable for Retail Investors, including high net worth individuals, institutions, family

Investment Objective & Policy: The Bateleur Long Short Prescient RI Hedge Fund is a long/short equity hedge fund. The Fund aims to produce returns in excess of inflation over the medium to longer-term, whilst placing a high premium on protecting capital. The manager in selecting securities for the fund will seek to follow an investment policy which will secure long-term capital growth in real terms. Subject to such restrictions as may apply under the Act, the Fund may invest in all financial instruments, including but not limited to equities, bonds, money market instruments, property shares, derivatives and debentures, whether listed or unlisted and in line with the conditions as determined by legislation from time to time. The manager shall use the commitment method to calculate the Fund's total exposure.. Hurdle rate: CPI inflation + 4%

Risk Guidance:

Moderate:

These portfolios generally hold more equity exposure than low risk portfolios but less than high risk portfolios In turn, the expected volatility is higher than low risk portfolios but less than high risk portfolios.

The probability of losses are higher than low risk portfolios, but less than high risk portfolios

Expected potential long term investment returns could therefore be lower than high risk portfolios due to lower equity exposure, but higher than low risk portfolios.

Leverage Risk:
This means that the Fund borrows additional funds, or trades on margin, to amplify investment decisions. This means that the volatility of the hedge fund portfolio can be many times that of the underlying investment. ments. The degree to which leverage may be employed in any given hedge fund portfolio will be limited by the mandate the client has with the Fund.

The risk of lower returns in a fund may vary depending on the choices made by the Manager or any Investment Manager, as well as the existence or non-existence of, or restrictions upon, any third-party security. The risk depends in part on the market risk and on how active the Manager is in the management of the Fund.

Liquidity Risk:

Not all securities or instruments (including derivatives and sub-investment grade bonds) invested in by the funds will be listed or rated and consequently liquidity may be low. Moreover, the accumulation and disposal of holdings in some investments may be time consuming and may need to be conducted at unfavourable prices. The funds may also encounter difficulties in disposing of assets at their fair price due to adverse market conditions leading to limited liquidity

Currency Risk:
