



#### FUND COMMENTARY

U.S. and international equities diverged as investors weighed the implications of a brewing trade war, waning consumer confidence and high valuations in the technology sector. After two years in a row of 20%-plus gains, U.S. stocks entered correction territory, falling roughly 10% in mid-March before recovering some of the losses. European stocks rallied as investors rotated into valueoriented areas of the market. Technology stocks fell the most, pressured by valuation concerns and worries that a strong run-up in artificial intelligence (AI) stocks had gone too far. The consumer discretionary sector also slipped on sharp declines in U.S. consumer confidence. Amid rising market volatility, energy and utilities stocks fared better as investors favoured solid, dividend-paying companies.

The portfolio finished the behind the MSCI All Country World Index (-2.26% vs -1.32%). The highlight of underperformance in Q1 is concentrated to some idiosyncrasies which Capital believes will be mostly transitory in nature. The most significant examples being Tesla, Broadcom and TSMC. Elsewhere however, the key structural components of the portfolio have been contributing in this new market environment for 2025, namely being overweight in Europe (+0.9%), underweight to US(+0.2%), underweight Magnificent 7 stocks (+0.5%) and underweight IT sector (+0.4%).

The Portfolio was a net seller of equities over the period, reducing positions across IT, communication services, energy sectors and more. There were marginal additions to consumer staples, financials and materials sectors. The main purchases were in European companies, with top 2 being industrials. Investors also added to European banks on the back of an improving outlook. European banks in general are benefiting from stabilization of interest rate expectations and solid earnings. The PPS portfolio added UniCredit one of the most shareholder-friendly banks in Europe run by best-in-class management, as well as Santander, which appears to be on a path of disruption with a focus on capital allocation ging forward. The top sale was in Novo Nordisk to reflect its incrementally higher risk in product competitiveness within its obesity franchise. The portfolio trimmed a number of semiconductor and related holdings after a very strong run in 2024. On average, these companies returned more than 100% last year. Also amongst trimmed positions was Caterpillar on a softer demand outlook for the next two years.

The fund has adhered to its policy objective.

#### Glossary:

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.
